Setting up of industries in Andhia Pradesh

1065. SHRI ADINARAYANA REDDY': Will the Minister of INDUSTRY be pleased to state.

- (a) what are Government's plans for setting up of industries in the backward areas of Andhra Pradesh for the year 1983-84;
- *b) what was the target fixed lor the year 1982-83;
- (c) whether the target was fully achieved; and
- (d) if not, what are the reasons therefor?

THE MINISTER OF INDUSTRY (SHRI NARAYAN DATT TIWARI): (a) From 1-4-1983 the Government have introduced a Central Scheme ol investment Subsidy on a graded scale under which backward areas have been indentified in Category 'A' 'B' & 'C- districts (copies of the Press Note issued containing the list of these districts has been placed in Parliament House Library). In Category 'A', quant'.im of subsidy will be 25 per cent subject to a ceiling of 25 lakhs, in Category 'B', the rate would be 15 per cent subject to a ceiling of Rs. 15 lakhs and in Category 'C\ the rate of subsidy would be 10

per cent subject to a ceiling of Rs. 10 lakhs. In -C Category MRTP and FERA companies are not eligible for any assistance. The existing industrially backward districts of Andhra Pradesh fall in the Categories 'B' and 'C Districts and as such all the districts are covered under Central Investment Subsidy.

Blocks/Taluks, urban agglomerations/extention of townships in Category 'B' & 'C districts where investment have exceeded Rs. 30 crores as on 31-3-1983 shall not be eligible for investment subsidy and concessional finance. MRTP/FERA companies have been permitted to set up non-Appendix —I industries which are not reserved for small scale sector with an export obligation of 50 per cent in respect of Category 'B' and 'C and 30 per cent in respect

(b) t° (d) During the year 1982-83, an amount of Rs. 2,67,00,269 was reimbursed to the St^{a1}:e Government in respect of subsidy disbursed to units set up in backward areas.

Pollution of river Godavari

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENT (SHRI DIGVIJAY SINH); (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) The treatment systems recommended are equalisation, neutralisation, clarificoculation or choke floa tation, sludge removal, drying followed by boilogical treatment.

(c) The State Board is taking appropriate measures against the polluting industries to regulate the dis-caarge of effluents into, the river.

Industrial waste thrown into water drains

- (a) whether Government have made any Survey into the level of pollution on the water supplied to Delhi residents by the Delhi Water Supply and Sewage Disposal Undertaking during (982-83;
- (b) the level of industrial wastes thrown into water drains of Delhi in 1982-83; and
- (c) the amount of DDT discharged by the Hindustan Insecticides in 1982-83 and its resultant health hazards?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENT (SHRI DIGVIJAY SINH): (a) Yes. Sir.

(b> 18,000 Kilolitres per day.

(c) The Hindustan Insecticides have established pollution abatement devices. When in perfect operation it contributes less than 1 Kg/per day of DDT which conforms to the standards laid down by the Central Boards.
