1253. SHRI HARVENDRA SINGH HANSPAL: Will the Minister of EDUCA -TION AND CULTURE be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that ancient sculptural panels at Suraj Kund, near Delhi are being wasted;
- (b) the action being taken to preserve these panels as well as against the indifferent officials concerned ?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRIES OF EDUCATION AND CULTURE AND SOCIAL WELFARE (SHRIMATI SHEILA KAUL): (a) and (b) There are no sculptural panels in the centrally protected monument, namely Suraj Kund masonry tank (near D^lhi) in District Faridabad, Haryana. There is, however, another Suraj Kund in M'-erut from where two sculptured panels were found during the course of clearance undertaken by the Meerut Development Authority. These panels have been handed over to the Meerut University and are kept in the Departmental Museum of the History & Archaeology of the Meerut University.

World Bank aid to National Agricultural Research Project

- (a) what is the present status of the World Bank aided National Agricultural Research Project run by the ICAR 1 vis its project targets/achievements, both tinancial and sicentific; and
- (b) whether Gove-nment are aware that ICAR has surrendered over Rs. 60 crores during last four years, if so, reasons for taking rupee loan from World Bank under the National Agricultural Research Project for which hardly Rs. 5-7 crorehave been spent so far?

THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE (RAO BIRENDRA SINGH): (a) The National Agricultural Research Project . (NARP) is being implemented by the Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR) from 1-1-1979 with assistance from DDA, an affiliate of the World Bank. The object of the project is to strengthen the regional research capabilities of agricultural universities. During the initial two years. the project implementation could not achieve full momentum due to the several resons like (a) the time taken to organise detailed Siate-wise research review for indentifying investment propo-,; • (b) noneligibility of IO agricultural universities for partcipation due to non-fulfilment of certain terms and conditions
