

Chief Ministers' Views on TV Programmes

1365. SHRI N. P. CHENGALRAYA NAIDU: Will the Minister of INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING be pleased to state:

(a) whether Central Government have sought the views of all the Chief Ministers on T.V. programmes;

(b) if so, how many Chief Ministers have so far communicated their views in the matter;

(c) which of the Chief Ministers have not so far communicated their views to the Government; and

(d) by what time a final decision in regard to the changes in TV programmes is likely to be taken?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING AND IN THE DEPARTMENT OF PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS (SHRI MALLIKARJUN): (a) The Government have sought views on National Programme from the Chief Ministers of these States where full-fledged programme producing TV Centres exist, i.e., the Chief Ministers of Tamil Nadu, West Bengal, Jammu and Kashmir, Maharashtra, Uttar Pradesh and Punjab.

(b) So far Chief Ministers of West Bengal, Tamil Nadu and Jammu and Kashmir have communicated their views. An interim reply has been received from the Chief Minister of Punjab.

(c) Replies have not been received from the Chief Ministers of Maharashtra and Uttar Pradesh.

(d) Improvements in TV programmes is a continuous process. All the suggestions received from various quarters, including those from the Chief Ministers, would be taken into account in effecting improvements in

TV programmes including National Programme.

Electronic Media between India and Pakistan

1366. DR. (SHRIMATI) NAJMA HEPTULLA: Will the Minister of INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government propose to seek Pakistan's cooperation for having electronic media between the two countries; and

(b) if so, by when?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING AND IN THE DEPARTMENT OF PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS (SHRI MALLIKARJUN): (a) and (b) It is presumed that the Hon'ble Member is referring to cooperation between the electronic- media, i.e. radio and television of the two countries. Such matters can be taken up in the meetings of the Indo-Pak Joint Commission which was set up recently. However, a final view in this regard has not yet been taken.
