### **USSR Offer of Open-end Spinning Plants**

- 1617. SHRI RAMESHWAR SINGH: Will the Minister of COMMERBE be pleased to state:
- (a) whether it is a fact that the USSR have offered to set up open-end spinning plants through U.P. Handloom Corporation;
- (b) if so, what is Government's decision in the matter:
- (c) whether Government are aware that standard cloth production scheme is working against the elementary interests of the weavers;
- (d) whether Government are aware that neither the quality varn nor the finance are being provided for the standard cloth) scheme or the Janata Dhoti Scheme; and
- (e) whether Government are also aware that payments to weavers are delayed for months and if so, what remedial steps Government have taken in this regard?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF COMMERCE (SHRI P. A. SANGMA): (a) Government are not aware of any such offer from USSR to set up open-end spinning plants through UP Handloom Corporation.

- (b) Does not arise,
- (c) Since there is no such thing as standard cloth in the handloom sector, it is presumed that the reference is to J anti t i cloth. The Janata cloth scheme has been introduced for the benefit of weavers by providing sustained employment to handloom weavers.
- (d) Government are not aware of any such difficulties. In fact when the yarn prices went up sometime back, Government had made special arrangements with yarn producers for supply of yarn at reduced prices particularly for meeting the needs of janata cloth scheme. As regards credit, the Co-operative Societies, whichj

are implementing the scheme, get concessional finance under Reserve Bank of India Scheme of concessional finance.

## **Export of Railway Engines**

- SANTOSH KUMAR, 1618 SHRI SAHU: Will the Minister of COMMERCE be pleased to refer to the answer to Unstarred Question 199. given in the Rajya Sabha on the 22nd February, 1983 and state;
- ta) whether Government have decided io export railway engines; and
- (b) if so, what are the details thereof and progress made so far in the matter?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF COMMERCE (SHRIMATI RAM DULARI SINHA): (a) Yes. Sir.

(b) In 1977, 15 diesel locomotives valued at Rs. 8 crores and 5 steam locomotives valued at Rs. 1.2 crores were exported to Tanzania. During 1982-83, 9 diesel locomotives and spares of the value of Rs. 754.39 lakhs have been supplied to NTPC (India) against global tenders under IBRD financing. This is treated as deemed exports.

### Problems of Tobacco Growers of Andhra **Pradesh**

- 1619. SHRI B. KRISHNA MOHAN-Will the Minister of COMMERCE be ple?s»d to state:
- (a) whelher Government are aware of the problems faced by the tobacco growers of Andhra Pradesh due to the manipulations of the private tobacco exporting companies; and
- (b) if so. whether Government propose-to nationalise the tobacco export trade?

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THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF COMMERCE (SHRIMATI RAM DULARI SINHA): (a) There is depression in Virginia tobacco marketing in Andhra Pradesh during this year due to increased production, outturn of higber proportion of lower grades of tobacco due to adverse climatic conditions and slack export demand.

The STC has been asked to purchase exportable grades' of VFC tobacco on ! ieir commercial account o i a no-profit no-toss basis and low grades of VFC co on Government account, with a view to mitigate the hardship of the Virginia tobacco growers of Andhra -Pradesh..

(b) No, Sir.

# Export of Products of Small Scale Indus/ries to Gulf Countries

1620. SHRI J. K. JAIN- Will the Minister of COMMERCE be pleased to . state-

- (a) which aie the countries in the Gulf region uid the Afro-Asian region presently importir.g products of small-scale industries frem India;
- (b) Wnether any assessment has been made regarding the potentials for export of Indiai products in these Countiies;
- (c) if so, what are the details in this legard; ; nd
- (d) w.'iat incentives are being provided tO small scale industries in India to in-.- case their exports to these countries?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF COMMERCE (SHRIMATI RAM DULARI SINHA): (a) Although no specific information is available abou the countries which import products of small scale industries from India, *til* the countries in the Gulf region and a large number of countries in the Afro-Asian region import products of small scale industries from India.

(b) and (c) No specific assessment has tieen made about the potential for export ef products of small scale industries from India to these countries but various studies undertaken by a number of Export Promoiion Councils and other Export Developmental Agencies reveal ihat ihere is considerable potential for export of products of small sacle industries from India.

(d) No specific incentives are provided to small scale industries in India to increase their exports to any specific country or countries. However, Import & Export Policy for 1933-84 docs contain several provisions which help exports of products from small scale industries ia India. •

## Closure of Jute Mills in West Bengal

- 1621. SHRI ARABINDA GHOSH: Will the Minister of COMMERCE be pleased to refer to the answer to Unstarred Question 893, given in the Rajya Sabha on the 1st March, 1983 and sate:
- (a) whether it is a fact that so far 16 jute mills in West Bengal are locked out/ closed leading to unemployment of 64 thousand workers; and
- (b) if so, what step? Government have taken in this regard?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF COMMERCE (SHRIMATI RAM DULARI SINHA): (a) The total number of jute mills in West Bengal which continue to remain closed or are under lock-out is 14 affecting about 42,000 workers. This includes three mills *viz*. Premchand Jute Mills, Naskarpara Jute Mills and Shri Ram Jute Mills which have permanently closed down and are not likely to reopen. The number of workers employed in these three mills were about 7.200.

(b) The matter comes within the jurisdiction of the State Governments and it Is for them to take appropriate action in the matter.
