(b) The shortfall in foodgrains production during the kharif season has been due to the adverse effect of severe and extensive drought in different regions of the country as also floods and cyclones in some State. The Government have mounted a vigorous rabi campaign to offset as far as possible the losses in kharif production and to this effect have taken steps to make available critical inputs such as diesel, power, seeds, fertilizers, pesticides etc. to the farmers. The import of wheat mentioned in Part— (a) will also strengthen the foodgrain reserves with public agencies.

News Report regarding parochialism in Indian politics

2056. SHRI LADLI MOHAN NIGAM: Will the Minister of EXTERNAL AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government's attention has been drawn to a news item that appeared in the 'Indian Express' of February 10, 1983, quoting annual report of State Department of U.S. wherein it has been stated that 'the parliamentary system may be affected by what is seen as increasing parochialism in Indian politics and the weakening of party structure; and

(b) if so, what is Government's reaction thereto?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SHRI A. A. RAHIM): (a) Yes, Sir. The newspaper report is based on extracts from "The U.S. State Department's annual report on Human Right practices to the U.S. Congress."

(b) The Government of India do not share the views expressed by the U.S. State Department.

Organisation of festival of India in the United States

2057. SHRI SHYAM SUNDAR MOHAPATRA: Will the Minister of EDUCATION AND CULTURE be pleased to state whether there is any proposal under Government's consideration to organise a Festival of India in U.S.A. on the pattern of the one which was organised in London, whether Government propose to take any initiative in the matter, if so, what are the details in this regard?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRIES OF EDUCATION AND CULTURE AND SOCIAL WELFARE (SHRIMATI SHEILA KAUL): Yes, Sir. The details of the Festival of India to be organised in U.S.A. are being finalised.

Release of foodgrains under the National Rural Employment Programme

2058. SHRI N. P. CHENGALRAYA NAIDU: Will the Minister of RURAL DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government have agreed to release the second instalment of foodgrains for the year 1982-83 under the National Rural Employment Programme though the states are unable to provide Full Utilisation reports;

(b) if so, what are the main reasons for the decision;

(c) whether this decision has been taken keeping in view the drought conditions prevailing in many parts of the country;

(d) whether the Ministry have been seeking full utilisation reports regarding funds and foodgrains both from the States before proceeding with the next stage of release;

(e) if not, the reasons for this relaxation;

(f) whether this Programme is being misused by the States; and

(g) if so, the steps taken or proposed to be taken to check the misuse?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF RURAL DEVELOPMENT (SHRI HARI NATH MISHRA): (a) to (g). Release of resources under NREP are made on **utilisatj\$»** ol at least 50 per cent resources given to the States earlier under the programme. However, taking into account the gap between the issue of release orders in respect of foodgrains and their actual supply to the executing agencies, release of second instalment of foodgrains during 1982-83 was made in case of some tSates, where utilisation reported was ^{ne&}r 50 per cent utilisation. The programme is being implemented by the State Governments generally in accordance with the guidelines issued, and cases of deviations, if any, are brought to their notice for appropriation action.

I.R.D.P. in Bihar

2059. SHRI RAM BHAGAT PASWAN; Will the Minister of RURAL DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state tile amount given so far by the Central Government to Bihar Government under the Integrated Rural Development Programme and the details of development works completed so far under the Programme?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF RURAL DEVELOPMENT (SHRI HARI NATH MISHRA): An amount of Rs. 2974.65 lakhs has been released to Bihar under the Integrated Rural Development Programme during 1980-81 to 1982-83 (upto date). Under IRDP the target group of beneficiaries are assisted to acquire productive assets which will enable them to increase their income. Any economically viable activity can be taken up under the IRD Programme in the primary, secondary and tertiary sectors. In the Sixth Five Year Plan upto February, 1983, 5,75,869 beneficiaries have been assisted in Bihar.

Child Guidance School, New Rajinder Nagar, New Delhi

2060. SHRI SUDHAKAR PANDEY: Will the Minister of SOCIAL WELFARE be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that the Child Guidance School, New Rajinder Nagar, New Delhi run by the Child Guidance School Society (Regd. Office) now at B-66, Moti Nagar, New Delhi, has not been reopened after summer vacation in July, 1982;

(b) whether the Directorate of Social Welfare, Delhi Administration gives grants to the school, if so, the details of grants for ^{the} last three years;

(c) whether the salary of staff and teachers has not been paid for the last one year; and

(d) if so, what steps Government propose to take to ensure that the school is reopened and also to conduct an enquiry into the affairs of the school?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRIES OF EDUCATION AND CULTURE AND SOCIAL WELFARE (SHRI P. K. THUNGON): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) Yes, Sir. The Directorate of Social Welfare, Delhi Administration had been giving grants to the Child Guidance School Society for its school and during the last three years the following grants were released to the Society:

1980-81	Rs. 19,200
1981-82	Rs. 50,000

No grant for 1982-83 was released as the Organisation had closed the school.

(c) About 4 months arrears of salary of staff members for the year 1981-82 have not been paid. Some old arrears were also to be paid.
