THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF IRRIGATION (SHRI RAM NIWAS MIRDHA): (a) to (d) The Gandak Project, a joint venture of Bihar and Uttar Pradesh is a Second Plan Scheme, which has had time and cost over-runs and is expected to be completed in the Uttar Pradesh portion during the Sixth Plan and the Bihar portion would spill over to the Seventh Five Year Plan period. The original estimated cost of the project as approved by the Planning Commission in 1961 was Rs. 52.03 crores. The cumulative expenditure upto March, 1983 as reported by the States of Bihar and Uttar Pradesh is expected to be Rs. 326.70 crores and 89.33 crores totalling to Rs. 416 crores as against the latest updated cost of Rs. 512 crores. The reasons for delay in the project are attributable to overall constraint of resources difficulties in land acquisition, changes in the scope of the project by way of supplementary work and timely of scarce non-availability construction materials.
