THE MINISTER OF PARLIA-MENTARY AFFAIRS, SPORTS AND WORKS AND HOUSING (SHRI BUTA SINGH): (a) The Special Organising Committee for the IX Asian Games, 1982 (SOC) has informed that no such record has been maintained by them.

- (c) All the Members of Parliament were extended invitation for the inaugural function of the Asian Games by the SOC.
