

**Amount written off as bad debt by N.F.D.C.**

**1943. SHRI ARVIND GANESH KULKARNI:** Will the Minister of INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that the National Film Development Corporation has written off a huge amount as bad debts and declared a considerable amount as doubtful debts;

(b) if so, what are the details in this regard; and

(c) what steps are proposed to be taken by Government to improve the financial position of the Corporation?

**THE MINISTER OF INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING (SHRI VASANT SATHE):** (a) and (b) Yes, Sir. Against a profit of Rs. 53.72 lakhs during the year 1980-81, the National Film Development Corporation has written off Rs. 49.14 lakhs as bad debts and shown Rs. 4.50 lakhs as doubtful debts. These bad and doubtful debts pertain to the erstwhile Film Finance Corporation/Indian Motion Pictures Export Corporation.

The above mentioned adjustments have been made by NFDC for accounting purposes. The Corporation is continuing to take steps to recover the amounts from the parties concerned.

(c) The financial position of the Corporation is being improved by bringing about stricter financial discipline, proper scrutiny of applications for financial assistance for production of films, increased exports of Indian films, expansion of distribution and exhibition net work for Indian and imported films and through the execution of projects like 16mm centre, sub-titling unit and VCR unit.

**Creation of Cadres for Employees of Doordarshan**

Will the Minister of INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government have created cadres for various categories of employees of Doordarshan;

(b) if so, the particulars thereof with their sanctioned strength as on 1st April, 1982, including deputation, leave and training reserves and the salaries applicable to various grades of each cadre;

(c) whether recruitment rules have been framed, in respect of these cadres;

(d) whether the Doordarshan has evolved a transfer policy for its employees; and

(e) what is the procedure for the selection of employees for higher training in India and abroad?

**THE MINISTER OF INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING (SHRI VASANT SATHE):** (a) to (c) The engineering staff of Doordarshan is borne on the common cadre with AIR. For Group 'A' and Group 'B' posts of the Programme Cadre of Doordarshan, separate recruitment rules have since been notified. Recruitment rules for staff artists have also been issued. Action has been initiated to frame the recruitment rules for the remaining categories of Programme, Administrative and miscellaneous posts.

Information about the sanctioned strength including leave reserve etc. of various categories of posts and their pay/fee scales is indicated in the statement. (See below).

(d) Posting/transfer of Doordarshan employees are made keeping in view the needs of the service and general instructions of the Government in this regard.

(e) The selection of employees for higher training in India and abroad is made on the basis of seniority-cum-merit, qualifications, experience and expertise in the field, future utilisation of the training for the benefit of the organisation etc.

#### Publication of Number of Copies by Newspapers

1945. SHRI SYED SHAHABUDDIN;  
DR. SARUP SINGH:

Will the Minister of INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING be pleased to state:

(a) the number of newspapers which have so far complied with the Government order to publish prominently the number of copies of the previous issue;

(b) whether some newspapers have challenged the order in a court of law and obtained an interim stay order;

(c) the rationale behind the order;

(d) whether the Government inspection machinery cannot be tightened to check the number of copies actually printed promptly; and

(e) whether Government propose to revise of the order?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING (SHRI ARIF MOHAMMED KHAN): (a) According to the information available with the Registrar of Newspapers for India, the number of such newspapers is 32.

(b) No such instance has come to the notice of the Government.

(c) The order has been issued with a view to monitoring the consumption of newsprint by newspapers.

(d) while all efforts are made for checking the circulation of newspapers by the Inspection Teams of the Registrar of Newspapers for India, it is not possible to check the circulation of all the newspapers regularly and at frequent intervals because of limitation of resources.

(e) The position will be reviewed after six months after the newspaper industry has started complying with the revised Newsprint Control Order, if it is found that the newspapers are facing genuine hardship entirely due to this order.
