Irrigation facilities during sixth five year plan

558. SHRI PYARELAL KHAN-DELWAL: Will the Minister of IRRIGATION be pleased to state:

(a) the target of additional areas to be given irrigation facilities during 1982-83 and in the remaining part of the Sixth Five Year Plan;

(b) what is the total financial outlay proposed for this; and

(c) whether the cost escalation has upset the programmes as well as the targets?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF IRRIGATION (SHRI Z. R. ANSARI): (a) The target for creation of additional irrigation potential during 1982-83 has been fixed at 2.851 million hectares. A target of 9 million hectares of additional irrigation potential in the remaining three years including 1982-83 of Sixth Five Year Plan period has been fixed.

(b) and (c) An amount of Rs. 8665 crores is likely to be spent for the irrigation sector during the remaining three years of the Sixth Plan period. The approved outlay for the year 1982-83 is Rs. 2056 crores. Besides, the expected mobilisation from institutional sources is about Rs. 295 crores. In order to achieve the target of additional irrigation potential and to meet the escalation of costs of projects, an additional outlay of Rs. 2600 crores will be necessary during the remaining three years of Sixth Five Year Plan of which additional outlay of Rs. 750 crores is required for the year 1982-83.

Subarnrekha River Irrigation Project

559. SHRI SANTOSH KUMAR SAHU: Will the Minister of IRRIGATION be pleased to state:

(a) whether the inter-state Subarnrekha River Irrigation Project has finally been approved by Planning Commission, if so, by when the project is likely to be completed; and

(b) whether Government have set up a joint Board to execute the project?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF IRRIGATION (SHRI Z. R. ANSARI): (a) The inter-State Subarnrekha Project of Orissa and Bihar has been recommended by the Technical Advisory Committee for approval by the Planning Commission. As per the report the project is expected to be completed by 1992.

(b) The Joint Control Board for the execution of the Galudih Joint Project has been set up, as per the Bi-partite Agreement between Orissa and Bihar. The Chandil and Kharkal Complex would be constructed by Bihar.

Construction of Dams/Anicuts on Gandhi Sagar

560. SHRI BHUVNESH CHATURVEDI: Will the Minister of IRRIGATION be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that the Government of Madhya Pradesh has constructed dams/anicuts on the upstream of Gandhi Sagar on River Chambal violating the agreement with the Rajasthan Government;

(b) whether the Government of Rajasthan have lodged any protest in this regard; and

(c) if so, what steps the Central Government have taken for enforcement of the agreement?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF IRRIGATION (SHRI Z. R. ANSARI): (a) to (c) There is no formal agreement between Governments of Madhya Pradesh and Rajasthan regarding utilisation of Chambal Waters. The Government of Rajasthan reported to the Centre that the Government of Madhya Pradesh are constructing a

number of irrigation schemes in the upper reaches of Chambal Basin in the catchment of Gandhi Sagar reservoir which will result in reduced inflows in Gandhi Sagar reservoir consequently reducing irrigation and power benefits to their State. The matter was taken up by Ministry of Irrigation with the Government of Madhya Pradesh. In the meantime the Government of Rajasthan informed in February, 1981 that they would sort out the matter bilaterally with the Government of Madhya Pradesh.

A letter was recently been received from the Chief Minister of Rajasthan stating that the Government of Madhya Pradesh should be asked to stop taking up any new irrigation scheme in the upper reaches till the issue is settled. The Union Minister of Irrigation has written a letter to the Chief Minister of Madhya Pradesh requesting that the matter may be settled amicably between the two State Governments.

Flood-Prone Areas

561. SHRI SANTOSH MITRA: Will the Minister of IRRIGATION be pleased to state:

(a) what is the total flood-prone area in the country, State-wise; and

(b) what is the amount of Central assistance provided to the States to Control the floods during the last three years, State-wise?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF IRRIGATION (SHRI Z. R. ANSARI): (a) An area of 34.64 million hectares, as reported by State Governments, is prone to floods in India. State-wise figures are at Statement.

(b) State-wise break up of the Central Assistance provided to States during 1979-80, 1980-81 and 1981-82 under flood control sector is given at Statement II
