Tuticorin and Baroda Heavy Water Plants

Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state:

- (a) the percentage of work done at the Tuticorin and Baroda Heavy Water Plants in 1981-82; and
- (b) what are the results of the investigations carried out into the causes of strikes at these two plants?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE DEPARTMENTS OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY, **ELECTRONICS** AND AND **OCEAN ENVIRONMENT** DEVELOPMENT (SHRI **CHANDRA** PRATAF NARAIN SINGH): (a) The Heavy Water Projects at Tuticorin and Baroda are both operational and had functioned at the level of 50 per cent and 63.75 per cent of stream factor respectively during 1981-82. In turn they had attained a production of about 47 per cent and 41 per cent respectively of the targets fixed for the year.

(b) There was no strike at the Heavy Water Plant, Baroda, but the employees of the Tuticorin Plant had gone On strike in 1979, because of inter-union rivalry. Due to continued labour unrest and the agitational approach of the workers; the Managements of these Plants were forced to declare lockout of the Plants for short duration in 1979 in the case of Tuticorin Plant and in 1982 in the case of Baroda Plant. Situation at both these plants are since normal and the cause of the strike/lockout is attributable to inter-union rivalry; industrial disputes etc.
