Vocational and professional training institutes for tribals

1993. SHRI O.T. LEPCHA: Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government have chalked out any National Policy for expansion and development of vocational and professional training institutes for tribals in the country;
 - (b) if so, the details thereof State-wise; and
- (c) what steps are being taken by Government to implement this Plan?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRIMATI D. PURANDESWARI): (a) to (c) The National Policy on Education, 1986 stresses the need for strengthening of the vocational education with special emphasis on, interalia, tribal students. The existing Scheme of Vocationalisation of Secondary Education at +2 level is being implemented through the State/UT Govts. The State/UT Govts. are responsible for identifying the priority areas such as tribal areas. There is no specific programme in the Ministry of Human Resource Development for setting up of vocational/professional training institutions for the tribals.
