

(c) According to the Molasses Control Order, 1961 as amended from time to time, a Molasses Fund has been set up with the contribution of Rs. 20/- per ton of the molasses produced from Sugar factories and Rs. 30/- per ton from Khandsari Units for constructing Pakka storage facilities to contain pollution. To expedite the construction of these storage facilities, a meeting of the Officers of the Ministry of Chemicals, Department of Environment, Central Board for Prevention and Control of Water Pollution and the State Trading Corporation was held recently and a plan of action was formulated.
