According 10 the information received from the Indian Embassy, Doha, five Indian banks had correspondent arra' igements with IFECO. The IFECO had opened rupee accounts with all the five Indian banks which were overdrawn at the time of closure. According to the Indian Embassy, Doha, a number Of Indians are also reported to have los't money consequent on the closure of IFECO. The exact qua^itum of these losses to Indian banks and the Indians are yet to be assessed.

Reserve Bank of India has already advised the Indian banks concerned to take steps for safeguarding their

interests. It is reported that one of partners of IFECO has filed a petition in the local court for the liquidation of the company. RBI has advised the concerned banks file to claims against 'the company in due consultation with their legal advisors.
