

by what time the schemes will be implemented?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRIES OF EDUCATION AND CULTURE AND SOCIAL WELFARE (SHRIMATI SHEILA KAUL):

(a) No targets have been fixed for the Sixth Five Year Plan (1980-85), although the Sixth Five Year Plan Document, under paragraph 14.15 in Chapter 14 on Minimum Needs Programme, envisages 100 per cent coverage of all illiterate adults in the age group 15-35 under the Adult Education Programme by 1990.

(b) Efforts are being made to cover as many adult illiterates as possible in the age group 15-35 during the Sixth Five Year Plan, within the allocations made for this programme.

Apart from the State Adult Education Programme, the following Central and Centrally Sponsored Schemes are already being implemented:

(i) Rural Functional Literacy projects;

(ii) Strengthening of Administrative Structures for Adult Education;

(iii) Assistance to Voluntary Agencies working in the field of Adult Education; and

(iv) Shramik Vidyapeeths.

Government Aided School Teachers' Association

424. SHRI M. KALYANASUNDARAM: Will the Minister of EDUCATION be pleased to state:

(a) whether Director of Education, Delhi has received any memorandum from the President of the Government Aided School Teachers' Association regarding take over of management of private schools now by Government;

(b) if so, what are the details thereof; and

(c) what steps Government have taken thereon?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRIES OF EDUCATION AND CULTURE AND SOCIAL WELFARE (SHRI P. K. THUNGON):

(a) Yes, Sir.

(b) According to information furnished by the Delhi Administration, the Association in their memorandum dated 13-4-82 has demanded that aided schools where managements have remained in the hands of the Government for more than 5 years may not be handed back to the erstwhile managing committees.

(c) The demand was examined by the Delhi Administration and they are of the opinion that it would be contrary to law to retain the management of such schools beyond a period of 5 years—which is the maximum period of take over laid down under Section 20 of Delhi School Education Act, 1973.

All India Council of Sports

425. SHRI AMARPROSAD CHAKRABORTY: Will the Minister of EDUCATION be pleased to state:

(a) whether the All India Council of Sports is having any general superintendence over the many sided activities of the All India Railway Sports Control Boards, the All India P. & T. Sports Control Boards and other Sports Control Boards of All India nature;

(b) if so, what are the details thereof; and

(c) if not, by when and in what manner Government propose to streamline and coordinate the multifarious activities of the above type of All India Sports Control Boards in order to produce better results?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRIES OF EDUCATION AND CULTURE AND SOCIAL WELFARE (SHRI P. K. THUNGON):

(a) Such departmental sports control boards are the concern of the relevant departments. In any case the role of

the All India Council of Sports is purely advisory in nature.

(b) Does not arise.

(c) Advice of the All India Council of Sports will be sought on this matter.

(c) if so, the names of such schools where these posts have been filled up

together with the names of such schools where these posts have not been filled up; and

(d) what steps Government propose to take to see that these posts are filled up without further delay by appointing meritorious and legitimate claimants?

Soviet Naval Presence in the Indian Ocean and South China Sea
