**Issue of Passports**

2712. SHRI CHO S. RAMASWAMY: Will the Minister of EXTERNAL AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that it takes more than 60 days to issue Passports even after police verification;

(b) if so, what steps are being taken to reduce the time limit for issue of Passports;

(c) what is the total number of applications pending in all metros for issuing passports; and

(d) the steps taken to send the Passport to the party within 15 days time after making verification?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SHRI AJIT KUMAR PANJA): (a) No, Sir. After clear police verification reports are received. It normally takes between a week and 10 days for issue of a passport depending upon the number of applications during that period.

(b) and (e) Government is continuously taking steps to reduce the time taken for the issue of passports. Such recent steps include improved links with the police authorities to reduce delays, proposing online communication of police reports in selected areas, widening the accessibility and availability of application forms, introducing a pilot project for machine writing of passports and improving the computerisation at the passport offices.

(c) A statement is enclosed (*see below*).

(d) Prompt linking of police reports with applications, machine-writing of passports and use of speed post for delivery are some of the measures taken for issuing passports soon after police reports are received.

An application is considered pending only when it is not yet completed without any objection and where a police statement has been received but on which a passport has not been issued by a Passport Office within five weeks of the application being filed.
