- (d) whether any loyal workers and these officials belonging to essential services were prevented from entering into the office on that day; and
- (e) if so, what are the details thereof and what action was taken by Government to protect the loyalworkers?

Infiltration of Bihari Muslims of Bangladesh in India

2192. SHRI ROBIN KAKATI: Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government are aware that more than three lakh Bihari muslim who are citizens of former East Pakistan (now Bangladesh) have been deprived of citizenship by the present Bangladsh Government and

are now planning to enter India in an organised way; and

(b) if so, what steps Government of India have taken to prevent them from entering into India?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI YOGENDRA MAKWANA): (a) There have been reports that a number of non-Bengali Pakistani nationals stranded in Bangladesh are planning to enter India in an organised way in an attempt to cross over to Pakistan.

(b) BSF and the State Police forces have been alerted to maintain strict vigil along the border and effectively prevent any such attempted incursion into Indian territory.
