A decision has now been taken regarding these charges and the building plan<sub>s</sub> will be sanctioned in accordance with the re-development scheme on payment of the development charges by the individuals.

#### **Proposals f<sup>or</sup> aew thermal power projects in West Bengal**

Will the Minister of PLANNING .be pleased to state:

(a) whether the Central Government's attention ha<sub>3</sub> been drawn to the news item which appeared i<sup>o</sup> Economic Times, Calcutta, dated the 31st January, 1981 to the effect that West Bengal Government's proposals to start work on a number of new thermal powe<sub>r</sub> projects during the Sixth Five Year Plan period, has received a big set back because plan-, ning Commission is not inclined to approve any new proposal of the State Government except the second stage of the Kolaghat Thermal Power Project; and

(b) if so, what are the details in thi<sub>s</sub> regard?

THE MINISTER OF PLANNING AND LABOUR (SHRI NARAYAN DATT TIWARI): (a) and (b) According to the Electricity (Supply) Act, 1948 concurrence of the Central Electricity Authority is required before any power scheme is taken up for execution by the State Electricity Boards. Investment approval for such schemes i<sub>a</sub> given by the Planning Commission only after the above statutory requirement i<sub>a</sub> fulfilled. Planning Commission has neither rejected nor withheld any proposal for setting up a new thermal power project i<sub>n</sub> West Bengal which has been cleared by the Central Electricity Authority.
