## Composition of the third level airlines

- 74. DR. RAFIQ ZAKARIA: Will the Minister of TOURISM AND CIVIL AVIATION be pleased to state:
- (a) the details about the composition, structure and financial arrangements of the third level airlines; and
- (b) what are the places where it will operate and what are the various fares to be charged?

THE MINISTER OF TOURISM AND CIVIL AVIATION (SHRI A. P. SHARMA): (a) A Company called "Vayudoot Private Limited" has been set up for operating third level air services initially in the North-Eastern Region. The Company has been registered under the Companies Act as a joint venture of Air India and Indian Airlines with equal equity participation for which the budgetary support has to come from Government. The Board of Directors of the Company are appointed by Air India and Indian Airlines with the approval of the Govevrnment. So are the Chairman and the General Manager of the Company. The air services are being operated by F-27

## Supply of Refined Groundnut Oil

- 75. DR. RAFIQ ZAKARIA: Wilt the Minister of CIVIL SUPPLIES be pleased to state:
- (a) what is the latest position about the supply of refined ground^ nut oil;
- (b) whether Government are taking any steps to increase its production; and
  - (c) if so, what are the details thereof?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF CIVIL SUPPLIES (SHRI BRAJAMOHAN MOHANTY): (a) to (c) No separate statistics of production of refined groundnut oil are being maintained by Government. The production of groundnut oil of both raw and refined has in recent years been of the order of about 14 lakh tonnes (the figure computed on the basis of groundnut production).

There is sufficient refining capacity in the country to produce refined

groundnut oil- However, a significant increase in its production would also require increase in production of groundnut in the country.

The various measures that Government are taking to increase the production of groundnut include the following:-

- Increase acreage/under (1) cultivataion;
- (2) Raising the productivity levels, through a package of practices and incentives;
  - (3) Providing support price.

## Raising of Loan Celling- by State **Finance Corporations**

- 76. DR. RAFIO ZAKARIA: Will the Minister of FINANCE be pleased to state:
- (a) whether it is a fact that various State Finance Corporation, have benn authorised to raise the limit of their loan amount from the present limit of Rs. 30 lakhs to 50 lakhs in view of the Government having raised the amount of plant and machinery for small scale units from Rs. 10 to 20 lakhs; and
- (b) if not, by when Government propose to direct the Reserve Bank and the Industrial Development Bank of India to take immediate steps in this direction?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF **FINANCE** MAGANBHAI BAROT): (a) and (b) As per the provisions of section 26(1) of the State Financial Corporations Act, 1951, the State Financial Corporations are at present authorised to render financial assistance to an industrial concerns up to Rs. 30 lakhs in the case of companies set-up under the Companies Act and cooperative societies registered under the Cooperative Societies Act and up to Rs. 1'5 lakhs in any other-case. In the State Financial Corporations conference held in October, 1980, among other things, the question of raising the present limits of accommodation was also considered. Accordingly the Industrial Development Bank of India has

forwarded to the Government early this month certain proposals relating amendments to the State Financial Corporations Act, 1951 which inter-alia include raising the limites from Rs. 30 lakhs to Rs. 60 lakhs and Rs. 15 lakhs to Rs. 30 lakhs. These will b5 processed by the Government in due course.

## **Consumer Price Index**

77. SHRI DINESH GOSWAMI; SHRI SHRIDHAR WASTJDEO DHABE:

Will the Minister of FINANCE be pleased to state:

- (a) what is the rise in the consumer price index in the last six months in respect of essential commodities; and
- (b) the steps being taken to pre vent inflation and rise in prices or to neutralise its effect on fixed income groups like salaried employees?

THE MINISTER OF FINANCE (SHRI R. VENKATARAMAN): (a) The All India Consumer Price Index for Industrial Workers (1960=: 100) shows an increase of 5.7 per cent in the last six months that is between June and December 1980 (the latest available) this compares with the increase of 8.4 per cent in the same period of 1979.

(b) A number of anti-inflationary measures have already been taken including removal of infraincreasing structure bottlenecks and production: (ii) strengthening of the public distribution system; (iii) augmenting the domestic availabilities through imports; (iv) curbing the anti-social activities such as hoarding and black-marketing and (v) controlling undue expansion in money supply and
