Thus, it is clear that type C quarters being constructed under the crash programme have less plinth area than the type II quarters already constructed.

(d) Type III (C) quarters at Baba Kharak Singh Marg sanctioned before 1978 have got three rooms while those sanctioned in 1978 have got two rooms. Type II(B) quarters in Sector H & J Kali Bari Marg have two rooms. Type B & C quarters under construction in DIZ area have got two rooms.

Rise in Price of Butter Oil

Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government have recently increased the price of butter oil;

(b) if so, to what extent and what are the reasons for increase.

(c) whether it is a fact that this butter oil is received free by Government;

(d) if so, for what purpose it is received free; and

(e) what are the names of countries from which butter oil was received during 1980-81 and the quantity received from each country and the expenditure Government had to incur on this account?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE AND RURAL RECONSTRUCTION (MISS KAMLA KUMARI): (a) to (d) Butter oil is received by the Indian Dairy Corporation (IDC) as a part of food aid being given by the European

Economic Community (EEC) for implementing the Operation Flood II Dairy Development Programmes. Under this programme, approved by Government, the IDC, the project authority is required to sell the gift skim milk powder and butter oil, primarily for use in recombination during the lean season. The project also visualises the sale of limited quantities of butter oil as cooking medium. The funds so generated are to be used as resources for the Operation Flood II Project.

The price of butter oil sold directly for use as cooking medium has been increased from Rs. 17 per Kg. fixed in 1977 to Rs. 20 per Kg. in March, 1981, by the Indian Dairy Corporation taking into account the increase in prices of desi ghee in the same period.

(e) The quantity of butter oil imported on gift account from the European Economic Community during 1980-81 was 7,100 tonnes. The Government did not incur any expenditure on the import of butter oil as the supplies were received as part of free gifts for the Operation Flood II Programme.
