THE MINISTER OF POWER (SHRI SUSHILKUMAR SHINDE): (a) Government of Orissa have submitted proposals for 8 districts out of total of 30 districts, of which 'in principle approval' has been given for Angul and Nayagarh District at a cost of Rs. 217.42 crore in May, 2006.

(b) and (c) Rajiv Gandhi Grameen Vidyutikaran Yojana (RGGVY) aims at electrification of all villages in the country by 2009 including Orissa.

As per 2001 census, no. of inhabited villages are 47529. As on 31.3.2004, 37663 villages were reported electrified, with the balance un-electrified villages being 9866. Action Plan for number of villages to be electrified is as under:

(b) The State-wise break-up of number of Kendriya Vidyalayas to be established has not yet been finalized.

(c) Details of 34 Kendriya Vidyalayas sanctioned for opening during the years 2004-05 and 2005-06 are enclosed as statement.
