release of wagons to coal contractors on an out-of-turn basis as reported in "SUNDAY" in its issue of 20th December, 1981; and

(b) if so, what are the details thereof and what are the reasons for issuing the orders for the release of wagons on an out-of-turn basis as mentioned above?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF RAILWAYS AND IN "HE DEPARTMENT OF PARLIA-MENTARY AFFAIRS (SHRI MALLI-KARJUN): (a) Yes.

(b) Often requests are received from industries, which are duly spon-ored by various sponsoring authorities, for immediate allotment of wagons for movement of coal to relieve distress and avoid closure of their factories. To avoid stoppage of production and retrenchment of labour, out-of-turn allotments, wherever considered appropriate are made to ameliorate the distress of the consumers.
