Cheaper rent wable Energy

2692 SHRI MUI.LIDHAR CHAND-RAKANT BHAI>DARE: Will the "PRIME MINISTEB be pleased to state what steps are being taken by Government to make renewable energy cheaper and to biing it within the reach of the common man?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE DEPARTMENTS OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY, ELECTRONICS AND ENVIRONMENT AND OCEAN DEVELOPMENT (SHRI CHANDRA PRATAP NARAIN INGH): Under t ie research, deve-opment and demonstration programme taken ur by Government, several devices ard systems for the utilisation of ne\[[and renewable energy sources hi ve been developed]

in the country. Among the systems which have been commercialised or are nearing the stage of commercial production are biogas digesters and engines, solar water heating systems, solar timber kilns, solar drying units, solar cookers, solar stills, windmill pumps, etc. Research and development work is continuing towards improvements in efficiencies and reduction of costs

Fiscal incentives have been introduced to promote industrial production of renewable energy devices and systems. Demonstration projects are being taken up on a countrywide basis to create awareness towards greater utilisation of the systems and devices and for field trials which would assist in the development programme. It is expected that with! increase in volume of production and improvements in technology, the initial costs will further reduce; and, since the operating cost_s are negligible, renewable energy devices and systems would become economically viable increasingly for a larger range of users.

Annual plan outlay for Delhi

- (a) whether the Annual Plan Outlay for Delhi for 1982-83 has been placed at Rs. 200 crores against total Sixth Plan Outlay of Rs. 800 crores and the current years' (1981-82) Outlay of Rs. 164 crores; and
- (b) if so, what are the new projects proposed to be covered with the help of the additional outlay?

THE MINISTER OF PLANNING (SHRI S. B. CHAVAN). (a) and (b) The size of Annual plan for 1982-83 has been fixed at Rs. 200 crores as against the Sixth Plan, 1980—83 outlay of Rs. 800 crores and the current year's (1981-82) outlay subsequently enhanced from Rs. 164 crores to Rs. 179.10 crores.
