Recommendations of Working Group on IT for Masses

(a) whether the working group on "IT for Masses" set up by his Ministry has submitted its report to Government recently as reported in the 'Hindustan Times' dated 30th July, 2000;

(c) which are the schemes likely to be implemented indicating the budgetary allocations proposed to be made by Centre and State Governments for spreading IT amongst masses particularly IT education infrastructure in 60,000 schools across the country?

THE MINISTER OF PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS AND MINISTER OF INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY (SHRI PRAMOD MAHAJAN): (a) to (c) Ministry of Information Technology (MIT) had set up a Working Group on IT for masses which submitted its report to the Minister for IT on 29.7.2000.

The main recommendations of the Working Group are as below:—

— Establish IT infrastructure in 60,000 schools over a period of five years.

— Web enabled citizen oriented Government services.
