Public Sector companies know-how collaboration agreement with multi-nationals.

 the know-how collaboration agreements which have been entered into by public sector Drug companies with multinationals;

 - (c) whether it is a fact that after entering into such agreements, production of antibiotics in the public sector companies has fallen during the last three years; and
 - (d) what compensatory clause has been incorporated in the agreement to compel the foreign technical know-how supplier to compensate for chronic loss of production?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF PETROLEUM, CHEMICALS AND FERTILIZERS (SHRI DALBIR SINGH): (a) and

- (b) A Statement giving the requisite information is enclosed. [See Appendix CXVI, Annexure No. 87].
- (c) In Indian Drugs and Pharmaceuticals Limited (IDPL), the production of Penicillin and Tetracycline during 1977-78, 1978-79 and 1979-80 fell while undertaking expansion utilising foreign technology. The reason for the fall was simultaneous expansion keeping the existing production on.

In Hindustan Antibiotics Limited (HAL), the production of Penicillin and Streptomycin has been increasing except in 1979-80 which was due to strike by workers in HAL. The production of Ampicillin has been increasing.

(d) Since these agreements are in the nature of supply of strains, knowhow or technical information, compensation clause for loss of production was not relevant.
