THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF RAILWAYS (SHRI MALLIKARJUN): (a) Two pairs of trains provide convenient day time and overnight services between these places and adequately meet the traffic requirements of this section. The punctuality of these trains has also been quite satisfactory.

(b) Passenger amenities such as platform (covered shed at Jaiselmer), piped water suoply, second class waiting halls and upper class waiting rooms, latrines for ladies and gents, benches 'and shady tre^ at the platform, booking' windows, electric lighting arrangements and tea stalls are provided at Jaiselmer and poka-ran.

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (SHRI NIHAR RANJAN LASKARt: (a) to (d) The study Group set up jointly by the Indian Council of Social Science Research and the Indian Council of Medical Research has submitted a report in August, 1980, under the title "Health for all: An alternative strategy". This report *inter-alia* seeks to redefine the position of the doctor and the drugs in this new model of an integrated, promotive, preventive and curative approach to health care." This report needs through in-depth study before any detailed opinion is formed by the Government.

It may be correct to some extent that some doctors do prescribe drugs with limited medical potential, but to imoMcate the entire medical orofes-sion wouTd not be correct. Government has no information regarding the prescribing habits of doctors engaged in private tractive Moreover qualified doctors are exnected and do prescribe what they consider +0 be in the best interest of the patients.
