was requested by the Delhi Police  
to advise them on the training to be  
given to police personnel in dealing  
with industrial relations. To suggest  
an appropriate training programme,  
a brief study in the industrial areas  
of Naraina, Okhla and Faridabad  
has been taken up by the Institute,  
which is expected to be completed  
by February, 1981.

### Worker's Education Scheme

Education scheme launched by Central  
Government in controlling the unrest

meant for the labourers of urban

(c) if not, how many rural areas  
have been covered under this scheme  
particularly in Karnataka :

spent on this scheme every year ?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN  
THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR  
(SHRI P. VENKATA REDDY):

(a) Workers' Education Scheme has  
been assessed by individual experts/  
Committees on various occasions in  
the past. They have observed that  
the Scheme has been successful in  
improving the process of collective  
bargaining, inter-union relations and  
in making workers better aware of  
their duties and responsibilities.

(b) Workers' Education Scheme  
is not confined to urban areas but  
covers industrial undertakings, mines  
and plantations wherever they be.  
It has also been extended recently  
to rural workers, workers in the un-  
organised and small scale sectors.

(c) The Regional Centres at Ban-  
galore, Mangalore and Kubli in  
Karnataka State have covered rural  
areas in the districts of Kolar, Tum-  
kur, Belgaum, South Canara, Shi-  
moga, Bijapur and Bidar.

(d) The Scheme broadly serves  
the following objectives:

(i) It will equip all sections of  
workers, including rural work-  
ers towards their effective  
participation in the social  
and economic development  
of the country.

(ii) It develops leadership among-  
st the workers and will  
thereby strengthen the trade  
union movement.
