मामले पर श्रनौपचारिक रूप से विचार-विमर्श हुआ था श्रौर तव भारतीय पक्ष ने बंगलादेश के स्थानीय श्रीधकारियों द्वारा की गई कार्रवाई पर गम्भीर चिंता व्यक्त की थी । श्रायोग ने फैसला किया था कि स्थानीय स्तर की समिति की तुरन्त बैठक होनी चाहिए श्रौर उमे श्रपेक्षित सर्वेक्षण करने चाहिए तथा उत्पन्न मामलों को तय करने की कोणिण करनी थाहिए ।

स्थानीय स्तर की समिति की बैठक 5 नवम्बर 1980 को हुई थी। दोनों पक्षों के बीच ग्रसहमित थी: बंगलादेण के पक्ष का कहना था कि उन्होंने केवल मौजूदा ठोकरों (स्पर्म) की केवल मरम्मत की है, जो तट को पुश्ता लगाने के ग्रमुजेय काम का भाग है. ग्रांग इसलिए कोई सर्वेक्षण ग्रादि करने की ग्रावश्यकता नहीं है।

चूंकि इन मामलों को स्थानीय स्तर पर हल नहीं किया जा सका, इसलिए एक स्थायी समिति, जिसका नेतृत्व संयुक्त नदी आयोग के दोनों पक्षों के एक-एक सदस्य द्वारा किया जाएगा, इस क्षेत्र का निरीक्षण करेगी और मतभेदों को यथासंभव शीघ्र तय करने की कोशिश करेगी।

† THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF IRRIGATION (SHRI Z. R. ANSARI): (a) Government of Tripura have reported that in contravention of the agreed decision of the Joint Experts Committee in March 1979 and of the Joint Rivers Commission decision of November 1979, Bangladesh had during May-June, 1980 gone ahead with the constrengthening, struction. raising of three groynes on the Muhuri river opposite Belonia Shashan Ghat.

The matter was raised by the Tripura Government officers at the meeting of the Local level Committee held on 5th June, 1980. The matter also came up for informal discussions at the 20th meeting of the Joint Rivers Commission held in New Delhi from 29th August to 31st August, 1980, when the Indian side expressed their grave concern at the action taken by the local officials of Bangladesh Government. The Commission decided that the local level committee should meet immediately, make such surveys as are necessary and try to sort out the issues which had arisen.

The Local Level Committee had its meeting on 5th November, 1980. There was disagreement between the two sides, the Bangladesh side stating that they had only repaired existing spurs as a part of the permissible bank revetment work, and that no surveys etc.. were therefore necessary.

As the matters could not be sorted out at the Local level, the standing committee headed by a Member of the Joint Rivers Commission from each side will inspect the area and try to sort out the differences as soon as possible.]

the past four years by the attack of two particular pests Aphids and Prodenia and the indigenous pesticides are not competent to control disease and that this pest ruins the crops on about one lakh acres of land every year; and

(b) whether Government taken any action to import the more effective chemical popularly known as "Tanaran" from West Germany wipe out the pest?

THE MINISTER OF STATE THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE AND RURAL RECONSTRUCTION (SHRI R. V. SWAMINATHAN): (a) Chilly crop is affected in various degrees by thrips, aphids, mites and Prodenia in different parts of the country. No precise estimate of damage chilly corp by aphids and prodenia alone has been reported. However, an incidence of 2,605 hec. affected thrips, mites, dieback and Prodenia on chilies along with 100 per cent control achieved by applying indigenously formulated Pesticides of Methylodemeton, Dithane Z-78 and Dursban was reported from Tamilnadu during October, 1979. Research trials under Coordinated Project showed that Dimethoate 0.1 per cent was the best insecticide in controlling aphid populationus.

(b) In view of what has been stated in answer to part (a), question of import of Tanaran does not Secondly it does not stand registered as yet under the Insecticides Act, 1968 for use in the country.

Death of a Child in the Pond of Cathedral Nursery School, Church Road, New Delhi

(a) whether it is a fact that an innocent child, name, Nehar Verma

alias Bobby, aged 4, S/o. Shri V. K. Verma, T. V. Cameraman (an old freedom fighter ward) died accidently in the pond of Cathedral Nurserv School Church Road, New Delhi on 12-11-80 due to the negligence of the staff during school hours; and

(b) whether Government propose to frame rules to avoid such mishaps and save the lives of students in school premises in the Capital?

THE MINISTER OF EDUCATION AND SOCIAL WELFARE (SHRI S. B. CHAVAN): (a) According to the report received from the Commissionner of Police, Delhi, Nehar Verma alias Bobby, aged 4 years died accidentally due to drowning in the pond located in the garden of the residence of the padri of the Cathedral Church, adjacent to the Cathedral Nursery School, Chuch Road, New Delhi, on 12-11-80. No culpable negligence of the staff has been found.

(b) As the death of the child was accidental, Government do not propose to take any action in the matter.
