Under the scheme, financial assistance is provided by the NCDC, on the following lines to secondary lead and village societies in the through the State Government:-

- (i) Margin assistance monev upto Rs. 50,000 to Secondary level society to raise bank finance.
- (ii) In case of need transport upto Rs. 60,000 in the assistance shape of loan-cum-subsidy.
- (iii) Upto Rs. 12,000 for furnishing the retail outlet of lead society.
- (iv) Upto Rs. 5,000 to a village society for furnishing its retail outlet.
  - (v) Margin money assistance @ Rs. 5,000 for a small size village society and Rs. 10,000 for a large size society, for handling consumer business.

Since the inception of the scheme, the Corporation has sanctioned projects involving an assistance of Rs. 2576 lakhs upto 31st March, 1980 in 20 States of which Rs. 800|- lakhs was provided during 1979-80

In order to further boost up the rural consumer programme a provision of Rs. 900 lakhs has been made the current financial vear. during This includes Rs. 475 lakhs to village societies as margin assistance under the Central Sector 1.2 Scheme.

## Supply of Iron Ore to Iran from Kudremukh Iron Ore Project

- 227 SHRI LADLI MOHAN NIGAM: Will the Minister of STEEL AND MINES be pleased to state:
- (a) whether it is a fact that the Iranian Government have declined to honour the agreement entered into with the Government of Iran during late Shah's regime for the supply of iron-ore from Kudremukh Iron Ore Project:
- (b) if so, to what extent the ironore has been supplied to Iran as against the contracted supplies:
- (c) what are the reasons for declining the supplies of the remaining quantity of iron-ore by the present Iranian Government: and
- (d) what steps have been taken by Government to settle the issue?

THE MINISTER OF COMMERCE AND STEEL AND MINES (SHRI PRANAB MUKHERJEE): (a) to (d) The present Government in Iran have indicated that some of the provisions of the agreements concluded the previous Government in respect of the Kudremukh Iron Ore concentrate are unacceptable to them. They apparently feel that these provisions are not in their national interest. Dicussions have been held on two occasions in the past with the Iranian Government and the National Iranian Steel Company (the purchaser), with a view to resolving the differences. A high-level Indian delegation was scheduled to visit Iran early in October, 1980. Before this could materialise, the present hosilities between Iran and Iraq broke out.

2. According to the existing contract supplies of iron ore concentrate to Iran should have commenced by the end of August 1980. Though the Project company is ready to supply, no shipments have taken place so far as Iran has indicated that she would not be in a position to accept the supplies for about two years. Apart
