

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE (SHRI MAGANBHAI BAROT): (a) For the current year the World Bank have committed assistance of \$ 2 billion out of which \$ 1600 million will be provided by the International Development Association and the remaining \$ 400 million by the World Bank. Discussions are in Progress with the World Bank to explore the possibility of securing further loans under the new World Bank facility with structural adjustment lending or otherwise.

(b) As the discussions are still at a preliminary stage it is not possible to furnish any details.

(c) The particulars of loan assistance received by Government of India from the World Bank, repayments made and debt outstanding as on 30-9-1980 are indicated below:—

Footnote: The loans from IBRD carry interest at varying rates, ranging between 3.5 per cent per annum to 8.85 per cent per annum. The credits from IDA do not carry any interest, but only a service charge of 3/4 of one per cent per annum is payable to meet the administrative costs.

(a) There has been a mixed trend in the prices of essential commodities between August, 1980 and October, 1980 in as much as the wholesale price indices of some commodities have moved up, some have remained steady and some others have declined.
