Number of educated unemployed by 1983

372. SHRI SADASHIV BAGAITKAR: SHRI LADLI MOHAN NIGAM:

Will the Minister of LABOUR be pleased to state:

(a) the number of the educated unemployed on the live register of Employment Exchanges at the end of March, 1979;

(b) the likely rise in the figure of the educated unemployed by 1983; and

(c) the programme contemplated by the Government to provide employ ment opportunities to tackle the un employment problem?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR (SHRIMATI RAM DULARI SINHA): (a) Available information is in respect of the number of educated persons (matriculate and above) on the live register of employment exchanges, all of whom are not necessarily unemployed. Figures are collected as at the end of June and December each year. There were 69.37 lakh such persons on the live register at the end of June 1979 and 72.97 lakh persons at the end of December 1979.

(b) and (c) The Framework of tha Sixth Five Year Plan indicates, *inter alia* the programme thrusts in relation to promoting opportunities for gainful employment. During the Plan period additional opportunities for employment will become available through the large number of developmental projects to be undertaken by State and Central Governments. In addition, industrial growth both in the public and private sector will also help to generate employment opportunities.

As has been stated in the Framework, the issue of unemployment among the educated needs to be viewed in the medium term context of the Five Year Plan as also in the long term perspective so that a mutually beneficial relationship can be promoted among education, employment and development. The nature of the problem is such that no single pattern would orovide the needed solution. A decentralised approach is called for and a District Development Centre could become the focal point for employment planning. It is
