#### **Allegations against principal advisor to Governor of Assam**

\*149. SHRI ROBIN KAKATI:  
SHRI AJIT KUMAR SHARMA:†

Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government's attention has been drawn to various allegations against Shri H. C. Sarin, Principal Advisor to the Governor of Assam lately voiced by the people of Assam, particularly the students' community;

(b) if so, whether Government have caused any enquiry into the allegations;

(c) whether there has been a persistent demand for the withdrawal of Shri Sarin from Assam; and

(d) if so, the reaction of Government in this regard?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI YOGENDRA MAKWANA): (a) to (d). Some allegations have been made against the Principal Advisor to the Governor of Assam and demand has also been made from certain quarters for his removal. The allegations, however, have been found to be vague, baseless and without substance.

SHRI AJIT KUMAR SHARMA: Sir, in the present situation of Assam we needed an administrator who could

just try to solve the problems and satisfy the feelings of the people, but on the other hand the present Principal Advisor, who was sent by the Government of India to advise the Governor for the good administration of the State and for the welfare of the people, has chosen to do the opposite. He has started taking actions against the people. He has started organising resistance groups to the current movement and thereby causing widespread communal disturbances in the State. Now, in this context, not only the students and the people, but the entire Government servants have demanded that he should be withdrawn in the interest of the whole country and the State as such. I would like to know from the hon. Minister whether the Government is going to withdraw him from that State.

SHRI YOGENDRA MAKWANA: Sir, at present, there is no such intention on the part of the Government.

SHRI DINESH GOSWAMI: Sir, we have seen from the newspaper reports at one stage that Mr. Sarin was to be appointed as Governor of Assam. We have also seen from the recent newspaper reports that he is likely to be made the Governor of Jammu and Kashmir. May I know what truth is there so far as these reports are concerned?

SHRI YOGENDRA MAKWANA: Sir, there is nothing to say about this at this stage.

MR. CHAIRMAN: Quite correct.

SHRI YOGENDRA MAKWANA: When a decision is taken, everybody will know it.

#### **Infiltration by Pakistanis**

\*150. SHRIMATI SUSHILA SHANKAR ADIVAREKAR:†

SHRI SWAMI DINESH CHANDRA:

Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government's attention had been drawn to the posters circulat-

ed in August-September this year by the Pakistani based National Liberation Front in the border areas of Jammu and Kashmir State threatening massive armed infiltration into Indian territory through Kargil, Uri, Bandipore, Kupwara, Gurez, Tithwal, Kalakot, Rajouri and Poonch areas;

(b) whether it is a fact that a mass infiltration bid through Uri by about 80 armed Pakistanis was made in early August and was foiled by the timely action of our alert security personnel; and

(c) what is the number of Pakistani spies and saboteurs if any, rounded up from the border areas of Jammu and Kashmir during the last six months?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI YOGENDRA MAKWANA): (a) There is no information available to confirm that Pakistani based National Liberation Front circulated posters threatening massive armed infiltration into Jammu and Kashmir.

(b) No such infiltration has come to light.

(c) The information is being collected from the Government of Jammu and Kashmir and will be laid on the Table of the House when received.

SHRIMATI SUSHILA SHANKAR ADIVAREKAR: I would like to know from the hon. Minister whether in and around the same period when the so-called posters were distributed and pasted on the walls of Jammu and Kashmir Valley, there were any incidents of border violations by the Pakistani armed forces.

SHRI YOGENDRA MAKWANA: Sir, there was no violation during that period.

SHRIMATI SUSHILA SHANKAR ADIVAREKAR: Sir, there were rumours that after the disturbances in that area, certain anti-social and anti-national elements had gone underground. I would like to know from the hon. Minister whether any efforts have

been made by the Home Ministry to round up these elements to safeguard the security and safety of that area.

SHRI YOGENDRA MAKWANA: Sir, rumours are rumours. Even then I would like to say that it is a constant effort on the part of the Home Ministry to round up such elements.

SHRI JASWANT SINGH: Would the hon. Minister like to confirm or deny the statement by the Chief Minister of Jammu and Kashmir that in the projected convention that the Jamait-e-Tulba was intending to hold in Srinagar, firstly India was made one of the invitees; and secondly, the invitation letters were got printed in Saudi Arabia? Would the hon. Minister like to confirm or deny this? And following from this, how does the Government view...

MR. CHAIRMAN: Let him first either admit or deny it. Then something...

SHRI JASWANT SINGH: I am saying, Sir, that a statement was made by the Chief Minister of Jammu and Kashmir. The hon. Minister can either deny what the contentions of the Chief Minister of Jammu and Kashmir are, or confirm them. Following from that...

MR. CHAIRMAN: Then it becomes problematic. Let him first state what he has to. (Interruptions) I will give you a chance. It is like this. Questions are asked in court: "Did you go to the railway station?" He says, "No, I was in Calcutta on that day". And he says what follows. Come on, Mr. Minister.

SHRI YOGENDRA MAKWANA: Sir, the Chief Minister is competent to make any statement. I have nothing to comment on the statement of the Chief Minister.

MR. CHAIRMAN: But do you accept or do not accept it?

SHRI YOGENDRA MAKWANA: The Chief Minister is responsible for whatever he says...

**SHRI NAGESHWAR PRASAD SHAHI:** But what are the facts?

**SHRI YOGENDRA MAKWANA:** ... and without facts, no Chief Minister would make a statement.

**MR. CHAIRMAN:** Very well. What follows?

**SHRI JASWANT SINGH:** On account of the interruptions may I trouble the hon. Minister to repeat what he said? I could not hear what he said.

**SHRI YOGENDRA MAKWANA:** What I said was that the Chief Minister is competent to make the statement which he has made and I have nothing to comment on the statement of the Chief Minister.

**SHRI JASWANT SINGH:** So, he has not denied, Sir.

**MR. CHAIRMAN:** What is the next one you wanted to ask which I shut you out from?

**SHRI JASWANT SINGH:** Therefore, not having denied the contentions of the Chief Minister of Jammu and Kashmir, I would request the hon. Minister to let us know how Government views what obviously is a very serious matter—an organisation, a body inviting India to participate on the physical territory of India getting the letters printed in Saudi Arabia—and what steps the Government is intending to take as far as the Jamait-e-Tulba in Kashmir is concerned.

**SHRI YOGENDRA MAKWANA:** Sir, the Jammu and Kashmir Government has already taken action against the Jamait-e-Tulba.

**श्री जगदीश प्रसाद माथुर :** मंत्री महोदय के जवाब से ऐसा पता लगता है कि केन्द्र और प्रदेश सरकार के बीच में जहां तक पाकिस्तानी एलीमेंट्स के खिलाफ कार्यवाही करने या न करने का सवाल है कोई कोआपरेशन, कोई मेल नहीं है।

**श्री हरि सिंह नलवा :** ऐसा नहीं है।

**श्री जगदीश प्रसाद माथुर :** आप मंत्री नहीं हैं। अपने दुर्भाग्य से और मेरे सौभाग्य से आप मंत्री नहीं हैं। जम्मू और काश्मीर की स्थिति अलग है। कानूनन भी वहां पर दोनों इंटेलीजेंस एजेंसियां पहले भी काम करती थी, मिलिटरी इंटेलीजेंस भी काम करती है। यह कोआपरेशन है तो किस हालत में है और अगर नहीं है तो क्यों नहीं है? इसका एक उदाहरण दे देता हूं। कुछ महीने पहले वहां एक इंटरनेशनल मुस्लिम कांफ्रेंस हुई थी जिस में कि वहां की एम्बेसीज के डिप्लोमेट्स ने भाग लिया। क्या सरकार को पता है कि किन डिप्लोमेट्स ने भाग लिया और क्या उन्होंने इस प्रकार कन्वेंशन्स को तोड़ा या नहीं तोड़ा?

**श्री योगेन्द्र मकवाणा :** पहली बात तो यह कि आनरैबल मेम्बर का क्वेशन इमेजिनरी है। कोआर्डिनेशन पूरा पूरा है सेन्टर और स्टेट गवर्नमेंट में। जो कन्वेंशन हुआ उस के बाद ही जमायत-ए तुलबा के खिलाफ काश्मीर गवर्नमेंट ने एक्शन लिया है।

**श्री जगदीश प्रसाद माथुर :** तुलबा नहीं, तुलबा से पहले कांफ्रेंस हुई है, उस को मैंने पूछा है।

**श्री योगेन्द्र मकवाणा :** कांफ्रेंस होने वाली थी उस के पहले ही स्टेट गवर्नमेंट ने उस पर एक्शन लिया है।

**श्री जगदीश प्रसाद माथुर :** आप गलत कह रहे हैं। मैं तुलबा वाली कांफ्रेंस की बात नहीं कर रहा। उस के पहले जामायत-ए-इस्लामी ने एक कांफ्रेंस की थी जिस में बहुत से देशों के एम्बेसेडर्स ने भाग लिया। मैं उस को पूछ रहा हूं। (Interruptions) मेरा सवाल कुछ और है। वह शायद तुलबा का मतलब नहीं समझते। तुलबा का मतलब है स्टुडेन्ट्स। स्टुडेन्ट्स

काफ़ेंस नहीं । इस के पहले जामयते इस्लामी ने काफ़ेंस की थी जिस में... यहां की एम्बेसीज के कई लोग गये थे ।

SHRI HARI SINGH NALWA: Sir,...  
(Interruptions) You sit down, please.

श्री जगदीश प्रसाद माथुर : आप मंत्री नहीं हैं, बैठिए ।

SHRIMATI INDIRA GANDHI: Mr. Chairman, I resent these allegations that are made in and out of season constantly, and it clearly shows that they have nothing positive to contribute. That I am sitting here does not mean that I am going round telling people to stand up or to sit down.

MR. CHAIRMAN: Please sit down.

SHRIMATI INDIRA GANDHI: I think if you were looking in my direction, you would have seen that as soon as Mr. Nalwa got up, I made a motion for him to sit down. Now when everybody is shouting, nobody is going to hear what I am saying.

SHRI PILOO MODY: I was a witness to that.

SHRIMATI INDIRA GANDHI: Thank you.

PROF. SOURENDRA BHATTACHARJEE: Perhaps he wanted to get his chance. Then this.....

#### Winding up of Scooter India Ltd.

\*152. SHRI N. P. CHENGALARA-YA NAIDU: Will the Minister of INDUSTRY be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government propose to wind up Scooters India Limited;

(b) if so, whether Government have taken any decision in the matter;

(c) whether equity value of this Government enterprise has been depreciating since its inception, if so, the details thereof; and

(d) whether Government propose to compensate its share holders to make good this depreciation in investment?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF INDUSTRY (SHRI CHARANJIT CHANANA): (a) No, Sir.

(b) Does not arise.

(c) and (d) The listed value of the shares of the company (having a face value of Rs. 10/- each) dropped to Rs. 4.25 on 1-5-1978 but picked up subsequently and stood at Rs. 6.87 on 19-8-1980. The question of compensating the share holders on this account does not arise.

SHRI N. P. CHENGALRAYA NAIDU: Sir, it is 151 or 152?

MR. CHAIRMAN: It is 152. 151 has been transferred.

SHRI N. P. CHENGALARAYA NAIDU: May I know from the hon. Minister whether these losses are due to poor quality of the scooters manufactured there or mismanagement by the staff or by the Managing Director who is not able to manage it properly?

SHRI CHARANJIT CHANANA: In fact the quality of the scooter is not poor. It is good. Secondly, mismanagement was inherited by us and we are overhauling the management of the unit.

SHRI N. P. CHENGALRAYA NAIDU: Losses are occurred only if the quality is poor or if there is mismanagement. Now Clearly we can see that it is mismanaged or the quality is poor. That is why we are incurring losses. May I know from the hon. Minister whether he will think over to shift this factory to Rayalseema where there is drought and famine and the labour is cheap. Then Scooters India Limited can show profits.

SHRI CHARANJIT CHANANA: I confirm that I have told him that it is not poor quality, Sir, Secondly, regarding the management overhauling. I have already said that we are working on that. Thirdly, in fact, the production has already started increasing. In 1976-77 the production was 36,790, in 1977-78 it came down to 28,103, in 1979-80 it has gone up to 48,137 and from April to October this year the production is 24,364, and we are hoping that the production will be 50,000. Production and productivity, Sir, are interconnected. With better management we will have both better production and productivity and the question of shifting the unit therefore, does not arise.
