The Canada World Youth (CWY) Ls iluntary non-governmental Asso-on. The Youth Exchange Programme, sponsored by them, is intended to foster cross cultural communi-•ut a growing awareness ot social and economic issues in the parti-ling countries. The ^puth ' Exchange Programme agreed to between the Directorate General N.C.C. and the C.W.Y. envisages 6 months' training .experience for community living groups of Indian and Canadian Youth in the age group of 18-22 years for a period of 3 months each in ada and India. The area of study ire, cooperation, ironment, small business, social service and community groups. The programme also envisages billeting of individual placements and partici-tts with local families. This is the ond year of participation of N.C.C. in this programme.

- *a* Youth Exchange programme with nada World Youth (CWY). We
- had deputed 10 N.C.C. Cadets to nada under this programme. This

year the YHAI had expressed their ility to sponsor the programme and the responsibility to conduct the Youth Exchange Programme was, therefore, entrusted to the Directorate General National Cadet Corps. Accordingly, the Indian contingent consisting of one Coordinator, three Group Leaders and 21 participants, selected to participate in this year's Exchange Programme, left India for ada on the 25th October, 1980. for the first phase of programme, lasl for three months. The Coordinator is V.C.C. whole-time officer. Of the group leaders, two are N.C.C. officer (one male and one Lady officer) and. one is a YHAI candidate Ot the p ticipants, 17 are N.C.C. Cadets (12 boys and 5 girls) and 4 are YHAI participants (two boys and two girls).

•'1. The second phase of this year's programme in India will also be of 'A months' duration and will commence during the third week of January 1981, upon the return of the Indian contingent from Canada, along with a a contingent.

A. The C. W.Y. will meet the cost of international travel of all the participants. Indian and Canadian.
