- (a) whether it is a fact that Railways is deliberately neglecting the development of Jajpur-Keonjhar Road, Korai, Baitarani Road, Bandalo, Jakhapura, Jenapur and Haridashpur railway stations although Railways is getting maximum revenue from Orissa; and
- (b) whether it is also a fact that minimum passenger amenities are not available in all these stations?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF RAILWAYS (SHRI E. AHAMMED): (a) No, Sir.

(b) Minimum passenger amenities as provided in rules are available at these stations.

## Rail line in Orissa

685. SHRI RAMA CHANDRA KHUNTIA: Will the Minister of RAILWAYS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that Orissa has the shortest rail line in the Eastern Zone, although Railways is getting more revenue from Orissa;
- (b) the total length of railway line in the country, State-wise, as on 31st March, 2010; and
- (c) whether there is any special relaxation in criteria for railway projects for backward States like Orissa, Jharkhand, Chhattisgarh and Bundelkhand area of Uttar Pradesh?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF RAILWAYS (SHRI E. AHAMMED): (a) No, Sir. At 2385.41 route kilometres, Orissa occupies third position among 12 States of Eastern/North Eastern India. Data on revenue earning is complied on the Railways on zone-wise basis, and not State-wise.

(b) The State-wise length of railway line (route-kilometres) as on 31.3.2009 (latest available) is as under:
