annulled. This is the way in which the Congress (I) jg openly supporting the Amra Bengals. And what would happen if this bandh materialises? The Central Go/ernment has told them that they cmnot spare any more police. We are short of police. This is a very small St; te and the resources of the State are very small. Therefore, we cannot 1 eep more police. We want some Cent al assistance. And they refuse to s ;nd more Central police. And in the meanwhile they call this bandh also which means that the entire police which is working in the various villa es now will have to be sent to the cii.y of Agartala and once again comm inal clashes will take place. In this way, what the .Congress (I) there is interested in is not restoration of p ace and amity between the two co> nmunities but in aggravating the sh jation.

THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND RUI AL RECONSTRUCTION (RAO BIRENDRA SINGH): On a point of oiler, Sir. It is wrong to cast aspersion and make insinuations against a political party like this.

SHRI P. RAMAMURTI: I am not making aspersior B.

RAO BIRENDRA SINGH: These are aspersions. (Interruptions) He cannot be allowe I to make such aspersions one afte • another

SHRI BHUPESH GUPTA (West Bengal): This is our information. (Interruptions)

SHRI P. RAMAMURTI: I will be glad if you deny it.

RAO BIRENDRA SINGH: These are serious insinuations. If I start abusing another j .arty like this, will it be right in thi House?

SHRI BHUPESH GUPTA: I do not understand t .e meaning $_0f$ "aspersions" .

THE VICE-CHAIRMAN (SHRI SAWAISINGH SISODIA): Order please. . .

SHRI P. RAMAMURTI: You know, Sir, I am not a person who casts aspersions without any foundation. *(Interruptions)* Don't interrupt me. I did not interrupt vou. You please sit down. I am not yielding.

RAO BIRENDRA SINGH: I am pointing out to the Chair that this is wrong.

SHRI P. RAMAMURTI: I am also addressing the Chair.

THE VICE-CHAIRMAN (SHRI SAWAISINGH SISODIA): Order please.

SHRI P. MAMAMURTI: I am only saying that if t'hi_s thing materialises, then this would mean that the entire police forc_e which is guarding the villages will hav_e to be sent to Agartala and this would mean that there will be clashes. This is the fact that I am bringing out. Let them de_ny it; let them prevent it. I will be very happy. The only purpose for which I am bringing this out is for the Government and the ruling party to take note of this resolution of the Congress Committee there and to see that this thing is prevented. That is all my purpose. My purpose is nothing else. You verify it and prevent it. I will be the most happy man.

The Committee appointed by Government to review performance of Food Corporation of India

THE VICE-CHAIRMAN (SHRI SAWAISINGH SISODIA): Statement b_v Hon'ble Agriculture Minister.

उपसभाध्यक्ष (श्री सवाई सिंह सिसी-दिया) : वह विषय समाप्त हो गया। ग्राप बैठिये । स्टेटमेंट सुनिए ।

THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND RURAL RECONSTRUCTION (RAO BIRENDRA SINGH): Sir, pursuant to the statement made by the then Minister of State in the Ministry of Agriculture and Irrigation in Rajya Sabha on the 23rd May, 1979, the Government appointed a committee in November, 1979 with Shri R. R. Morarka, Member of the Rajya Sabha as Chairman and **four** other members to review the performance of the Food Corporation of India.

2. Before the Committee could get its work organised, certain developments calling for a fresh approach and reorientation of priorities 'nave taken place. The country has gone-through one of the worst droughts in several major States, and a near crisis situation in the availability and 'movement of sugar. In addition to the problems of movement, the Food Corporation of India has been called upon to shoulder responsibilities of an unprecedented diversity, scale and dimension. All these have highlighted the need for rethinking on the more fudamental facets of the FCFs charter and function_s rather than covering the same ground as had been covered by many and inter-departmental committees in the past. On a careful consideration 0i the various issues involved, the Government have come to the conclusion that it is no longer necessary for the Committee to continue its labours.

RAO BIRENDER SINGH; Sir, I have nothing to add. We will take the suggestion into consideration.

SHRI S. W. Dl [ABE (Maharashtra): Mr. Chairman, Sr, I want to raise a point of order.

THE VICE-C :HAIRMAN (SHRI ARVIND GANESH KULKARNI): On what?

SHRI S. W. DHABE; Yesterday, the hon. Minister...

THE VICE-CHAIRMAN (SHRI ARVIND GANESH KULKARNI): Just a moment. Let me first see what this problem is.

THE VICE-CHAIRMAN (SHRI ARVIND GANESH KULKARNI): That I do not know. I will enquire and let you know.

SHRI S. W. DHABE: That was to be done today. Will it be taken up after this debate or earlier?

THE VICE-CHAIRMAN (SHRI ARVIND GANESH KULKARNI): That, I will just check up.

DISCUSSION ON THE WORKING OF THE MINISTRY OF INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING —conid.

THE VICE-CHAIRMAN (SHRI ARVIND GANESH KULKARNI): Mr. Kalyan Hoy. Not present. Shri A. P. Janardhanam.

SHRI A. P. JANARDHANAM (Tamil Nadu): Mr. Vice-Chairman, Sir, this is a very poor country, and I fear that the colour TV is an ivory elephant for our country. Of course, the idea of providing TV to the rural areas is very much welcome. But, still, I think that the radio should be given precedence over the TV till we attain self-sufficiency. Cheap radios, even at the rate of about Rs. 50, should be the target.

Another thing is that our external serviceg need to be revamped. Externally our policies have to be well broadcast to the neighbouring nations, and to impress upon the world, our achievements and the need for our progress have to be well stressed. Our external services must be strengthened. Thei need for powerful transmitters has been stressed often by Members here.

Apart from all these things, every Government has the temptation to become self-laudatory. The Goebbelsian propensities may sometimes overtake certain overzealous people. Our Gov-ment should clear itself of all such temptations. This morning the Minister ruled out the minutes given to the
