ORAL ANSWERS TO QUESTIONS

MR. CHAIRMAN: Question No. 181.

Janata Hotel in Ahmedabad

*181. PROF. RAMLAL PARIKH: Will the Minister of TOURISM AND CIVAL AVIATION be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Central Government have received any proposal from the Government of Gujarat for establishing a Janata Hotel in Ahmedabad:
- (b) if so, when and what are the details in this regard; and
- (c) what action has been taken by the Government of India so far in this regard?

THE MINISTER OF SHIPPING AND TRANSPORT AND TOURISM AND CIVIL AVIATION (SHRI A. P. SHARMA): (a) and (b) Yes, Sir. In their letter dated 2nd January, 1979 the Government of Gujarat had interalia proposed the construction of a 600-bed Janata Hotel at or nearby Ahmedabad and suggested an outlay of Rs. 100 lakhs in the Central Sector for this project.

(c) The construction of Yatri Nivas (Janata Hotel) in the Central Sector will be taken up only after watching the operational results for 2-3 years of the Ashok Yatri Niwas project at Delhi, which is a pilot project.

PROF. RAMLAL PARIKH: Sir, before I could ask the supplementary, I want to draw your attention to the fact that according to the rules, we are entitled to see the answers at the Notice Office at 10.30, so that we can formulate our questions, unless we are given a statement. Today I went to the Notice Office and the answer to this question was not distributed by then and so I was deprived of formulating the questions.

MR. CHAIRMAN: If you are raising a point of order....

PROF. RAMLAL PARIKH: This is not a point of order, I must draw your attention, and I must make a submission that according to the rule half-an-hour before, answers to questions must be at the Notice Office. It is so every day; today it is not so. It is for you to inquire.

MR. CHAIRMAN: I will look into this very carefully.

PROF. RAMLAL PARIKH: Then I come to my question. Sir, I am surprised by the answer to part (c) of my question that they would wait for two or three years to see the operational results of the Ashok Yatri Niwas (Janata Hotel) in Delhi. this was not the decision earlier one taken by the Consultative Committee of the Ministry of Civil Aviation and Tourism of which I was a member: and I knew that the decision to construct Janata Hotels was taken primarily to meet the requirements of a large number of middle income group tourists who are coming from over the world and from all other parts of the country also, who are un-

able to afford these five-star or fourstar or three-star big hotels which have become absolutely inaccessible to the common people. What is to be seen in the operational examination? I do not understand what is to be examined. Here the simple point is "The number of tourists is increasing; particularly in Gujarat the number of tourists from among the common people from other States as well as from other countries of the world is increasing every year and there is tremendous shortage of commodation; accommodation is verely short because tourists are coming to see Mahatma Gandhi's Sabarmati Ashram; they are coming see the Gir Forest, the only place where you can see the lions and 'date with the lions' so to say. And also there is Mahatma Gandhi's birth place at Porbundar. Therefore proposal had been put by the Government of Gujarat that this Janata Hotel should be constructed soon cause other types of hotels cannot meet the requirements of the common toursists. Therefore I put a specific question to the hon. Minister whether he would consider this view of shortage of accommodation Sir, this is very inexpensive, even for the Government to consider it and even for the people to avail of Then what are the reasons? Why he is delaying the consideration of construction of this Janata Hotel at Ahmedabad? I am asking a specific

MR. CHAIRMAN: I wish you would please shorten your question. answer is already given, that they want to gain some experience.

SHRI A. P. SHARMA: That is right, Sir. I think you have answered the question on my behalf. That is the main....

MR. CHAIRMAN: I have not answered it. It is already there.

SHRI A. P. SHARMA: Sir, the hon. Member just now has put the same question again and my answer

again the same, that we have to wait for the evaluation of the Yatri Niwas which is being constructed at Delhi and then only will we think of setting up such types of hotels in three other metropolitan cities, Calcutta, Bombay and Madras. Ahmedabad will not come ino picture even then.

Minister, MR. CHAIRMAN: Mr. there is one question which Mr. Parikh can ask but which he has asked, about the one which you are constructing.

PROF. RAMLAL PARIKH: My question was pointedly raised and it has not been answered. That was, if you are delaying the construction the Janata Hotel, in the intervening period how are you going to meet the increasing number of tourists in Gujarat? Are you constructing some other hotels? It seems to me that you are perhaps allergic to the name 'Janata'. If it is so, you can change the name. But you have to meet the requirements of the tourists number is increasing. And have you assessed the requirements?

DR. BHAI MAHAVIR: The can be changed to 'Sharma Hotel'.

SHRI A. P. SHARMA: Sir. I have not to change the name. The name has already been changed 'Yatri Niwas'. I am trying to explain to my hon. friend and to the House that at the initial stage the decision taken to set up Yatri Niwas, which was earlier named as Janata Hotel, at four metropolitan cities. Ahmedabad was never under considera-Ahmedabad came into picture only because in the year 1978 there was a conference of the State Tourism Ministers and in that conference it was suggested that every State should send proposals for all such schemes. It was not for hotels only. In that scheme other were also included for development of tourism. In that conference, Government of Gujarat had suggested this. But I have already

that it is not under the consideration of the Government. First we to cover the metropolitan cities after evaluation of the Yatri Niwas Then after that any ohter proposal will be considered.

PROF. RAMLAL PARIKH: What steps are you taking to meet the rush of tourists, whether it is through the Janata Hotels or other types of hotels? The hon. Minister must answer I asked a pointed question, namely, what other measures the Ministry is considering to meet the shortage of accommodation for meeting the requirements of the increasing number of tourists who are coming to Gujarat, whether it is through this type of hotels or any other type of hotels? What are you going to do about it? Please enlighten us on that.

SHRI A. P. SHARMA: If there is any such necessity as the hon. Member is pointing out, that is for the State Government to consider. Central Government is not going to meet the necessities of the State Governments. If the State Government wants to construct a hotel like they can do it.

PROF. RAMLAL PARIKH: But the Tourism Department have also a duty to perform.

MR. CHAIRMAN: It is no use. Mr. Baneriee.

SHRI B. N. BANERJEE: It made clear some time back during the time of the previous Government that they would construct Janata Hotels in metropolitan cities. Now the Government has started the one at New Delhi. Am I right in understanding that the Government Gujarat wants the Central Government to finance and set up a Janata Hotel at Gujarat? If the Government of Gujarat had said that it wanted to start a Janata Hotel at Ahmedabad and had asked for some assistance from the Central Government, while the cost would have been borne by

the Government of Gujarat, possi-Government's reply would bly the have been different. Is it correct? The objection is that the Central Government cannot finance this because they have not yet seen the results of the Hotel which is being started at New Delhi. But if the State Governments want to start one in their State capitals and with their own finance, the attitude of the Government of India will be quite different.

SHRI A. P. SHARMA: Yes, will be. We have no objection if any State Government wants to start such hotels in their own respective On the contrary, if a State places. Government constructs such a yatri niwas at its own cost, the Centre will give certain suitable assistance like designing and other things.

SHRI KHURSHED ALAM KHAN: It is a fact that hotels are one of the infrastructures of tourism in country. It is also a fact that there is an acute shortage of hotels hotel beds in the country for tourists. Would it be possible for the Centre to construct janata hotels and meet the requirements of 5-star and 4-star and 3-star hotels also? Is it also not necessary that there should be some division of this work between the State Governments and the Central Government? Naturally the States should finance construction of janata hotels in their States. In view of this fact, will the Government consider advising the Gujarat Government and oher State Governments also that they should take up such projects in their States. Of course, they should be given necessary facilities and assistance which are available with the Centre.

SHRI A. P. SHARMA: Sir, I quite appreciate the anxiety of my friend. I have already said that if any State-why talk of only the Gujarat Government—wants to construct yatri niwas on their own, we will be too happy. We will also see. I have said, that in respect of design etc. we will be giving them assistance also.

SHRI U. R. KRISHNAN; Sir, I would like to know from the hon. Minister whether he is aware that the previous Government, the Janata Government, was planning to construct a janata hotel at Madras and that even the land was acquired for that purpose. I would like to know about the stage of the hotel.

SHRI A. P. SHARMA: Sir, I have already said that for the present we are constructing a yatri niwas in New Delhi. The construction of any yatri niwas in the Madras metropolitan city will depend upon the result of the evaluation of the janata hotel in New Delhi. It is a fact that the land was acquired, but no further progress has been made.

SHRI U. R. KRISHNAN: When the Delhi janata hotel you will like to construct, we do not know and then only he will be coming to other States.

MR. CHAIRMAN: That question has not been asked.

SHRI A. P. SHARMA: Sir, on the inauguration day I will invite the hon. Member to visit the yatri niwas in Delhi

SHRI A. P. SHARMA: Sir, as far as I know, we have not brought about any change in the name. This is already there.

MR. CHAIRMAN: That is all right. The last question. Mr. Rameshwar Singh, there will be another question.

श्री रामेश्वर सिंह : श्रीमन्, ग्रगर मृझ को मौका हैं।

SHRI SURENDRA MOHANTY: Sir, from the reply of the hon. Minister I understand that they are making a class distinction between the metropolitan cities and other places in the different States of India. the entire tourism revenue is mopped up by the Centre, may I know raison d'etre for the Government to discriminate against the States imposing upon them that they should construct the janata hotels or yatri niwas when the Central Government itself is constructing these hotels in the metropolitan There seems to be a distinction. What is the raison d'etre for this distinction?

SHRI A. P. SHARMA: This was a decision taken earlier, and we stand by that decision. The only change made for the present is that we will wait for the evaluation of the yatri niwas at Delhi and then we will go to other places.

श्री श्रानंत प्रतः विभागित महोदय मानतीय प्रतः वृद्ध बृद्धिमान श्रादमी हैं श्रीर मैंने जब जवाब दिया तो मैंने उसमें यह नहीं कहा था कि पिछनी सरकार ने ही नाम चेंज कर दिया था, बितक इन्होंने खुद श्रभी कहा है श्रीर मेरी जानकारी में जो यह कह रहे हैं, वह बिलकुल कि है। हम लोगों ने इसको चेंज नहीं किया है। लेकिन श्रार इनको किए भी कोई शक है, तो सैं इस बात का पता लगा कर के बता दूंगा कि इन्होंने चेंज किया था या हमने किया है।

- (c) if so, what are the reasons therefor;
- (d) whether Government propose to issue letters of intent to some different party for the U.S.A. agency; and
- (e) if so, what are the details in this regard?

THE MINISTER OF SHIPPING AND TRANSPORT AND TOURISM AND CIVIL AVIATION (SHRI A. P. SHARMA): (a) Yes, Sir.
