

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF TOURISM AND CIVIL AVIATION (SHRI CHANDULAL CHANDRAKAR): (a) Andhra Pradesh, like the rest of the country, abounds in places of tourist interest. However, Hyderabad and Nagarjunakonda are considered to be of major tourist importance from the point of view of promoting international tourism.

(b) and (c) Detailed proposals for the development of tourist infrastructure at the above two centres, as also at other centres falling on travel circuits to be identified for promoting international tourism are awaited from the Department of Tourism, Andhra Pradesh.

Reallocation of export quota for cotton waste

(b) if so, what are the reasons therefor;

(c) whether it has been alleged by All India Cotton Waste Exporters' Association that large number of outsiders had cornered the quotas;

(d) if so, whether any enquiry has been ordered into the allegation; and

(e) if so, what are the details in this regard?

THE MINISTER OF COMMERCE AND STEEL AND MINES (SHRI PRANAB MUKHERJEE): (a) and (b) 25,000 bales of cotton waste were allowed for export during 1979-80 and this quantity was allotted in November '79. After the permissible period allowed for shipment, it was found that only 5184 bales had been actually shipped. Joint C. C. I. and E. issued a fresh Notice for allocating the unutilised quantity. Based on the response to this Notice the remaining quantity was reallocated in March, 1980. There will be no further reallocation as the relevant year 1979-80 has since expired. Fresh export for the year 1980-81 will be considered as part of the over all policy for cotton exports for the year.

(c) to (e) A complaint was received by the Textile Commissioner to this effect, but this has no relevance in view of the fact that any Indian citizen is eligible for allotment on a first-come first-served basis. Lack of prior exporting record not a disqualification for this purpose.
