Conversion of Guntur-Macherla and Hyderabad-Mehboob Nagar-Karnool metre-gauge line

- (a) whether the work of conversion of Guntur-Macherla and Hyderabad-Mehboob Nagari-Karnool metre gauge-into broad gauge is proposed to be taken up;

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN ofTHE MINISTRY RAILWAYS (SHRI MALLIKARJUN): (a) (c) Guntur-Macherla conversion forms part of the composite project comprising of Bibinagar-Nadikude new line and Guntur-Macherla conversion to BG. Conversion of Guntur-Macherla section will be taken up after the Bibinagar-Nadikude new line is completed.

Hyderabad is already linked by a BG line with Secunderabad. There is, however, no proposal for conversion of the Secunderabad-Kurnool MG section to BG.

Ship building yards in India

1075. SHRI O. J. JOSEPH: Will the Minister of SHIPPING AND TRANS-PORT be pleased to state:

- (a) the names and locations of ship building yards in this country;
- (b) whether the ship building yards in the country undertake complete building of ships which includes manufacturing engines and all necessary accessories or only assembling those parts imported from other countries?

These Visakhaare Hindustan Shipyard, patnam; Cochin Shipyard, Cochin; Mazogon Dock, Bombay and Garden Reach Shipbuilders and Engineers Calcutta.

(b) Shipbuilding industry is basically an assembly industry. Although some items of machinery and equipment are imported from abroad, a large number of items are procured from indigenous manufacturers.
