

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI M.D. ALIASHRAF FATMI): (a) There is no such rule restraining the University of Delhi from conducting selections/ promotions prior to the completion of the term of the Vice-Chancellor, However, it is for the University to decide whether such actions could be postponed or not.

(b) The Selection Committees for appointment of teachers in the colleges of the University of Delhi are constituted in accordance with the provisions of relevant Ordinances of the University. These Ordinances provide for nominees of the Vice Chancellor on the Selection Committees and not of the Academic Council. Though it is advisable for the Vice Chancellor to make nominations out of a panel of experts recommended by the Academic Council, obtaining approval of the Academic Council is not a statutory requirement
