Four institutions namely) Vehicle; Research and Development EstaMishment (VRDE), Ahmadnagar; R> search Design and Standards Organisation (RDSO), Lucknow; Bhar; t Heavy Electricals Ltd. (BHEL), E nopal and Central Electro-chemica] Research Institute (CECRI), KaraiHudi are working on this. Two prototypes have so far been built and extern ,ve trials have been carried out. Fa irication work on the third prototype las started. The Department of Sc ence & Technology plans to substantially increase deve. lopment work ii this area during the current Five Ye ir Plan.

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF INDUSTRY (SHRI CHARANJIT CHANANA): (a) and (b) The proposal for the manufacture of passenger cars in the Public Sector was considered by the Government in 1972, and it was decided at that time not to proceed with the implementation of the project. There is no such proposal under consideration at present.

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI YOGENDRA MAKWANA): (a) There are 15 women IPS Officers out of which 13 are allocated to the following cadres:-

Bihar-1, Haryana-1, Himachal Pradesh-1, Kamataka-1, Madhya Pradesh-1, Tamil Nadu-3, Uttar Pradesh-3, Union Terri-tories-2. Two women IPS Officers are under training in S.V.P. National Police Academy, Hyderabad.

(b) and (c) IPS Officers are appointed by the Government of India on the recommendations of the U.P.S.C. These Officers are selected through the Civil Services Examination, conducted by the U.P.S.C. every year.
