- (a) whether Government are considering for empowering women through education;

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRIMATI KANTI SINGH): (a) and (b) The Mahila Samakhya Scheme is being implemented by the Government of India for the education and empowerment of women in rural areas, particularly of women from socially and economically marginalized groups. The scheme is operational in 9 States *viz.* Andhra Pradesh, Assam, Bihar, Gujarat, Jharkhand, Karnataka, Kerala, Uttaranchal and Uttar Pradesh. 3.87 lakh women in these States are being benefited under this scheme.
