(b) Most of the Pre-Sixth Plan works will be completed by the end of 1981-82 leaving only a few works to be completed by 1982-83. The Sixth Plan works sanctioned during 1978-80 are likely to be completed in the time span of 4 to 5 years, from the dates of sanction.

(c) All important and vulnerable passenger trains are provided with police escorts for prevention and detection of such crimes in trains. Railways maintain close liaison with State Police authorities at all levels and render necessary assistance

whenever required. About 2,000 RPF personnel have been deployed to assist the GRP in escorting passenger trains to deter the criminals and instil confidence among the travelling public. TTEs/Attendants/conductors have been instructed to remain vigilant to prevent entry of unauthorised persons in train coaches.
