Nationalisation of Sen-Raleigh Group of Industries

611. SHRI SANGDOPAL LEPCHA: Will the Minister of INDUSTRY be pleased to state what steps Government have so far taken for nationalisation of Sen-Raleigh Group of industries to bring the industries under integrated administration?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF INDUSTRY (SHRI CHARANJIT CHANANA): M/s. Sen-Raleigh Limited and its ancillary companies are presently under the management of the Central Government under the provisions of Section 18AA of Industries (Development of Regulation) Act, 1951.
