Will the Minister of EXTERNAL AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that he has recently visited the Soviet Union; and if so, what was the purpose of the visit;

(b) whether he had a talk with the Soviet Government for resolving the Afghan issue;

(c) if so, what are the details thereof; and

(d) whether any joint communique had been issued after his visit and if so, whether there has been any mention about the Afghan situation, if so, the details thereof and if not what are the reasons therefor?

THE MINISTER OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SHRI P. V. NARASIMHA RAO): (a) Yes, Sir, at the invitation of the Government of USSR I paid an official visit to the Soviet Union from 3—7 June, 1980.

(b) Among other subjects we discussed the situation in South West Asia.

(c) I have already made a Statement on the subject on the floor of the House.

(d) A copy of the Joint Press Statement issued at the end of the visit has also been placed on the Table of the House.

The Joint Press Statement refers to no third country by name.
