THE MINISTER OF EDUCATION AND HEALTH AND SOCIAL WELFARE (SHRI B. SHANKARA-WAND): (a) and (b) Presumably the reference is to the Chairman of the Managing Body of the Society, who is nominated by the President of the Society. As such, the question of discontinuance of any practice by Government does not arise.

Auction of posts of clerks in Southern Railway Personnel Branch

THE DEPUTY MINISTER *US* THE MLNISTRY OF RAILWAYS (SHRI MALLIKARJUN): (a) The toal number of casual labourers now working in Southern Railway is about 35,095.

- (b) There are no separate clerk* exclusively Sor dealing establishmaat work connected with casual labo rers.

- (d) At present, there is a complete ban on creation of new paste However, a yardstick for provision of clerical staff in the Personnel Branches.is being evolved and sanctioning of any additional post* eu be considered, after the yardstick is evolved and accepted by Govern ment. Meanwhile, as an interim measure, some ad-hoc relief has been given recently to the Peraonnet Branches as a whole.

Whereas r*** capacity for movement of export iron ore on Bailadilla-Vizag sector remained underutilised for want of demand for wagons, there was some shortfall in wagon supplies «*' the Barajamda-Paradip sector.
