Canction of posts of clerks in Southern Railway Personnel Branch

- (a) whether it is a fact that there are 45000 casual labourers now working in Southern Railway:
- (b) whether it is a fact that no clerical post in Personnel Branch has been sanctioned to prepare the salary bills of these casual labourers;
- (c) whether the Zonal Administration is treating personnel branch clerks as "bonded labour" to do the work without sanctioning additional posts as per yardstick; and
- (d) whether Government propose to sanction the required number of elerical posts in the Personnel

Branch to deal with the personnel matters of the casual labourers?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF RAILWAYS (SHRI MALLIKARJUN): (a) The toal number of casual labourers new working in Southern Railway is about 35,095.

- (b) There are no separate clerks exclusively for dealing establishment work connected with casual labourers.

- (d) At present, there is a complete ban on creation of new peaks. Whereas rail capacity for movement of export iron ore on Bailadilla-Vizag sector remained under-utilised for want of demand for wagons, there was some shortfall in wagon supplies on the Barajamda-Paradip sector.
