Modernisation of the textile industry

For this purpose Government have extended to the textile mills the facility of soft loans from Industrial Development Bank of India at concessional rate of interest on easy terms and have also liberalised facilities for the import of textile machinery which do not attract indigenous availability angle. The schemes of Hiodernisation however will have to be prepared and implemented by the individual units.
