THE MINISTER QF ENERGY AND OAL (SHRI В. A. GHANI KHAN А. CHAUDHURI): (a) In 1978-79, 11.89 lakh man-days were lost in Coal India \Ltd and its subsidiaries as a result j nf strikes. The estimated iosg in production as a result thereof is 10.33 lakhs tonnes. At an average notified coal price of Bs. 64.71 per tonne, this was valued at Rs. 6.64 crores.

(b) Financial loss repreaeHting tha difference between the saleg revenue and the additional cost involved in producing this quantity of coa], *over* and above the fixed cost, has been estimated at Rs. 3.5 crores.

(c) Coal India have reported that I all efforts were made to improve in- |dustria] relations. However, loss of rnandays mentioned in part (a) could Kot be avoided.

THE MINISTER OF IRRIGATION (SHRI KEDAR PANDE): (a) and (b) By June, 1980, total ii-rigatioB potential expected to be available is 57 million ha.-comprising 26.9 millioa ha. from major and medium schemes and 30.1 million ha. 'from minor' schemes. The Government propose to increase the potential to IIO miUioa ha. by 2000 A.D., out of which the potential from major and medium irrigation will be 58 million ha. Thus, the additional potential of about 31 million ha. from major and medium schemes is proposed to be created during the next four live year plans at the rate of 7.5 million ha. in each of the plans, subject to the availability Of financial resources.

THE MINISTER OF IRRIGATION (SHRI KEDAR PANDE): (a) and (b) The resumed eighteenth meeting o'f the Indo-Bangladesh Joint $^$ Jlivers Commission took place in Delhi between the 26th and 28th April, 198ft. The meeting discussed the issues left unresolved in the earlier meeting held from 27th to 29th February, 1980 regarding the long term schemes for the augmentation of the dry season flows of the Ganga and Tista water issues, and decided that these issues should be dicussed further, at the next meeting of the Commission scheduled *b* be held in Dacca.
