Supply of foodgrains tr. Mizoram

207. SHRI LALSAWIA: Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE AND IRRIGATION be pleased to state what steps are being taken by the Government to s^uPP^{1v} adequate quantity of foodgrains to Mizoram during rainy season?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE AND IRRIGATION (SHRI BHANU PRATAP SINGH): During tha period January to June, 1979, a quantity of about 14900 tonnes of rice has been issued by the Food Corpitation of India to Mizoram State. As on 1st July, 1979 there was a sto k of 1759 tonnes of rice with the Food Corpo--ition of India at Silchar for supply *ii* Mizoram. Necessary arrangements have bee_n made by the Food Corporation to ensure adequate supply of foodgrains to Mizoram during the 7iiiny season as under:

(i) The State Government of Mizoram has been requested by the FCI to lift stocks of foodgrains from Silchar, in addition to what is being transprted by the FCI itself.

(ii) It has been ananged in consultation with the Railways to hove 3500 tonnes of foodgrains pe_r day to North Eastern States from the North Zone. The movement is already taki'ng place at this rate and a large number of foodgrains wagons are available daily on th-j North East Frontier Railway.

(iii) A_n 'Officer on Special Duty' has been posted by the Focd Corporation of India at Gauhati to mairtain day to day coordinate", with the Railways and State Governments to ensure adequate and "eguiar supply of fo :..(grains to each state, including Mizoram as far ns possible.

(lv) Instructions ar2 already there with the Railways and the FI to ensure movement of foodgraip* wagons to Silchar for Mizoram, >n A priority basis.

International Fund for Agricultural Development

THE MINISTER OF AGR1CUL-I TURE AND IRRIGATION (SHRI SfPJEET SINGH BARNALA): (a) Maharashtra Composite Project compiling 6 major irrigation -iib-projects and 2 modernisation projects is under consideration of IDA and TTDA fcr providing loan assistance in the Bank's financial year 1980 (Jnly 1979 to June, 1980). The Bhima Project component of the Composite Project ia likely to be financed by the IFAD for which negotiations are likely to be held simultaneously with the negotiations for the Composite Project with the World .Bank. The negotiations for signing the agreements with IDA AND IFAD a_{re} Hely to be held shortly.
