

Kosuir_e of small industries in Gujarat

285. PROF. RAMLAL PARIKH: Will the Minister of INDUSTRY be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that small industries in Gujarat have closed down due to shortage of pig iron and other raw material;

(b) if so, what are the details thereof; and

(c) what remedial steps Government propose to take in this regard?

THE MINISTER OF INDUSTRY SHRI GEORGE FERNANDES: (a) and (b) Government are aware of the difficulties being faced by small industries (including those in Gujarat) using Pig Iron Steel, Coke etc. Government have received representations from the associations and others in regard to the difficulties in procurement of some of the above raw materials, to meet their full capacity requirement.

(c) Government have taken steps to augment the supplies of scarce categories of raw materials in the ferrous and non-ferrous categories through imports. Simultaneously, steps have been initiated by the State Government of Gujarat to weed out the non-actual users of these raw materials and to rationalise the supplies available to the genuine small scale units in the state.

(a) whether it is a fact that I. A. S. recruits are required to learn the regional language of the State which they opt for allotment;

(b) whether this rule is being followed in all cases;

(d) what measures Government propose to take to enforce this rule in all the States?
