Postponement of constructions of new railway lines

252. SHRI HARI SHANKAR Will the Minister of BHABHRA: RAILWAYS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that the proposals for the construction of new railway lines in some States have been kept in abeyance;
- (b) if so, what are the details of the rail lines so kept in abeyance; and
- (c) what are the reasons for the postponement of their construction?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF RAILWAYS (SHRI C. K. JAFFAR SHARIEF): (a) to (c) Sakri-Hassanpur, Rampur-Haldwani, Howrah-Sheakhala Chittauni-Bagaha are the four new railway lines, which could not he progressed due to limited funds and the need to expedite other on-going projects which are in advanced stages of construction. In addition to the constraint of funds, on the Chittauni-Bagaha link, the location of Gandak Bridge has also to be reviewed, on account of the change in the course of the river.
